Students outnumber jobs in Midland

The Midland Canada Employment Centre for Students has released the statistical performance for the period of February through April 30, 1986. During this time, 785 students registered at the Centre, including 499 secondary and 286 post-secondary students.

Two hundred and twelve vacancies have been registered, of which approximately 100 were created through the Summer Employment Experience Development Program.

Total placements were 116, which represents a 24.7 per cent increase over

the same period during 1985.

Post secondary students are encouraged to come into the Centre, at 525 Dominion Avenue in Midland, and register as they return from school. Currently there are a variety of career related vacancies which have start dates in early May.

Parks to open this weekend

John Winters, District Parks Supervisor with the Ministry of Natural Resources in Midhurst, stated in a news release dated May 2, that most pro-

vincial parks will be open to the public this weekend. Awenda, Bass Lake and Earl Rowe will be open from May 9 to Sept. 1, while Devil's Glen, McRae Point and Six Mile Lake will open May 9 and close Oct. 13. Mara opens June 20 and closes Sept. 1. Springwater and Wasaga

Beach Provincial Parks do not offer camping, however, they are open year round on a daily basis for the public's enjoyment.
