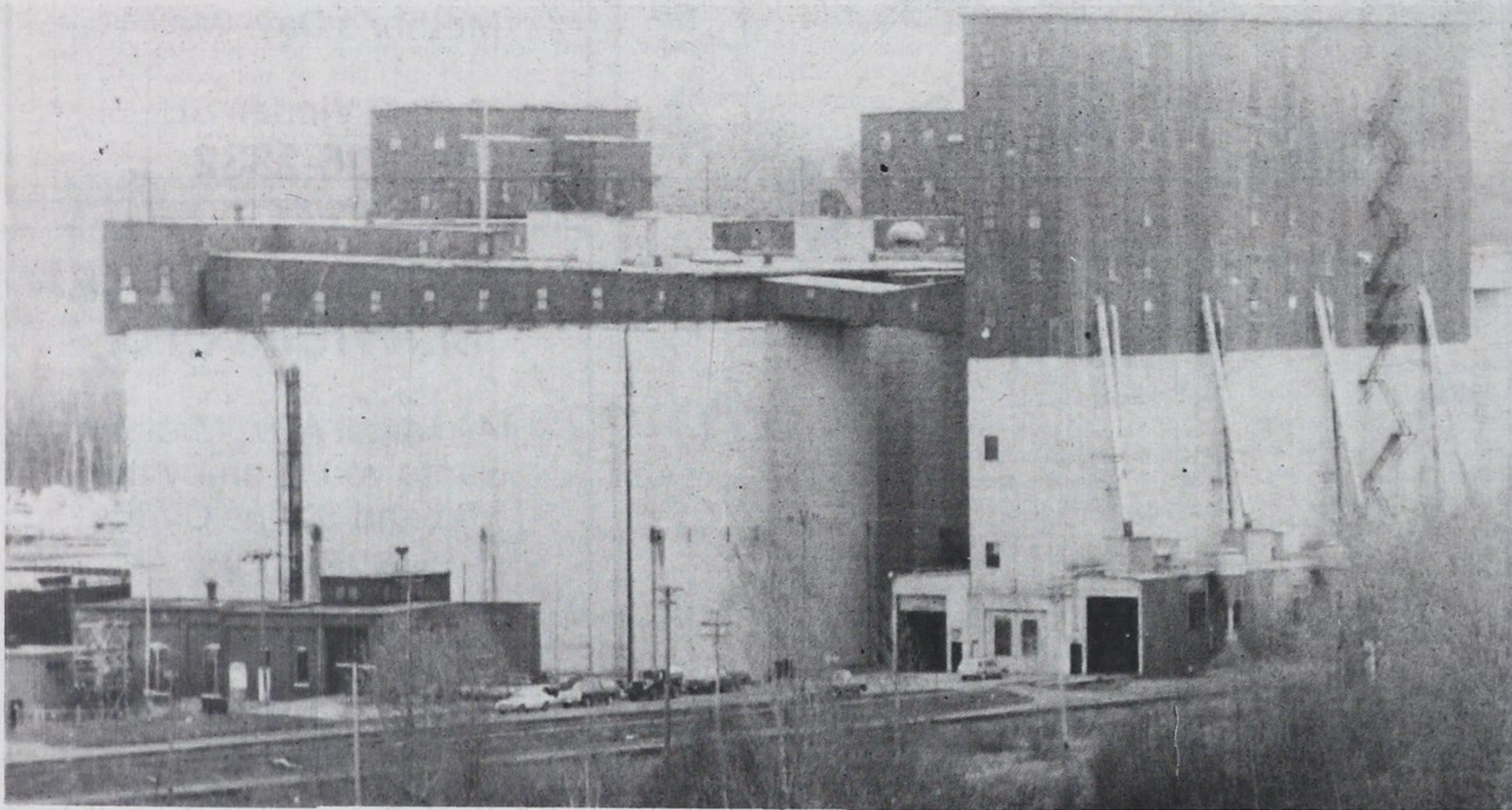




### Assembly line
