A provincial government ministry and a private wildlife conservation group are co-operating to make the Wye Marsh greener and fuller of wildlife than it is now.

The Ministry of Natural Resources and Ducks Unlimited propose to make a log dam between the bottom of the marsh and Georgian Bay higher, to keep out of the marsh Bay water in times of a high Great Lakes level.

Nutrients produced by tending across the country, marsh vegetation which is underwater stay in the vegetation's roots.
