July 13. So mark your calendars and come out to watch this new and fascinating sport. It is quite entertaining to say the least.

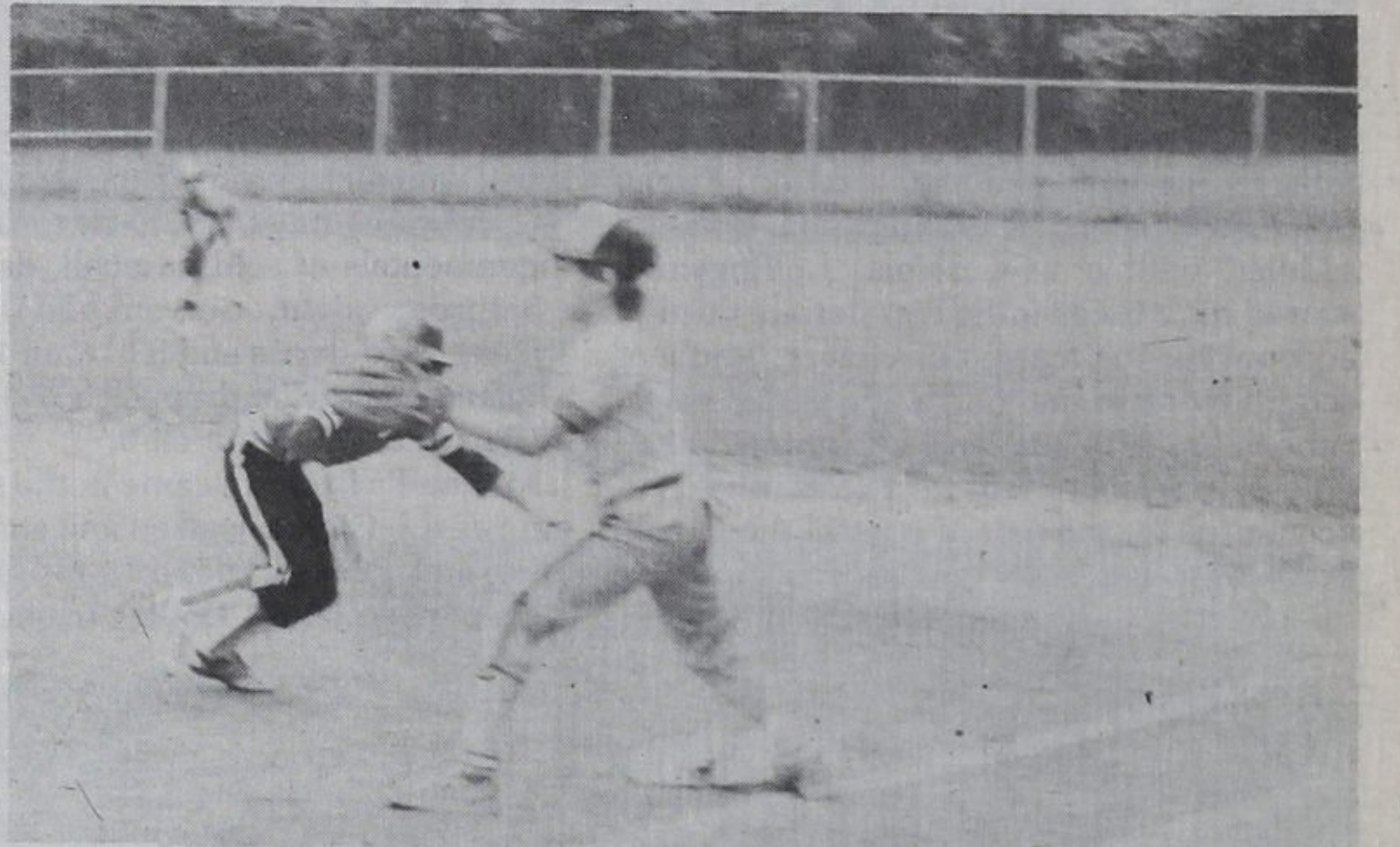
## Smith's win big in MMBMH


