

Monsignor Castex takes most improved

Monsignor Castex took the top three trophies at Tuesday's Midland Legion Branch 80, Area III Elementary School Track and Field Meet held at Sacred Heart. They not only won the Top School Award, they also captured the Most Improved, and ran off with the Top Relay Team Award.
