From snakes to the stars

Wetlands, snakes, and the summer sky, are the subjects of talks this month at the Wye Marsh Wildlife Centre.

Tomorrow at 7:30 p.m. Nancy Patterson of the Federation of Ontario Naturalists (FON) will help her audience discover Ontario's wetlands. The staff wetland specialist of the FON will survey the kinds of wetlands, the characteristic flora and fauna of each, and their fate. Wetlands in Ontario are being drained at a great rate.

Snakes, in particular the Massasauga rattlesnake, is the subject on July 23, also at 7:30 p.m. Warden of Georgian Bay Islands National Park Michel Villeneuve is a Massasauga expert. He

works on a project the purpose of which is to track the snakes after radio transmitters have been implanted under their skin.

And on July 30 at 8:30 p.m., Ian McGregor of the Royal Ontario Museum will help novice star-gazers spot Mars, Saturn, Venus, the Milky Way, and meteor

showers. Telescopes will be provided.

McGregor has worked as producer for the MacLaughlin Planetarium of Toronto.
