Revenge was sweet as they scuttled Barrie 2-0. In the first half, Rob Hitchcock sailed down the port ;wing and cut towards the ggoal deep to the enemies touchline. Barrie's keeper thought he had the angle covered but the swift winger sliced the ball through the porte into the top right side of the net.

Midland's defence, which has been a bit leaky of late, was water-tight. Larry Buckley in goal, repelled any boarders who slipped through the defence. Ben Lowell took the middle watch and was just as effective. Midland controlled the middle of the field and had opportunities to increase the lead but the forwards had their shooting boots on the wrong foot. Eventually, Dave Jupp lost patience with them, circumvented a defender and booted the ball past the keeper from 15 yards out. Scoring an average goal a game, his tally of nine goals, is tops among the middle field players in the league.

Midland success this season has them positioned in second place. Next Wednesday they are away to Barrie Italia, the league leaders. A win will give Midland the league lead, an unaccustomed role but one well earned.
