Discuss plans for site

Officials from the Huronia Historical Parks, Martyr's Shrine and the Wye Marsh Wildlife Centre want to sit down with the North Simcoe Waste Management Association (NSWMA) to discuss their plans for a new dump site in Tiny Township.

Members of the NSWMA were given a correspondence at last Tuesday evening's meeting of the association signed by John Barrett-Hamilton, general manager of the Huronia Historical Parks, Father James Farrell, director of the Martyr's Shrine and Bob Whittam, executive director of the Wye Marsh Wildlife Centre, voicing their opposition to the use of the Wayne Johnson farm in the south end of Tiny for a new landfill site.

In their letter to the NSWMA, the group re-

quested a meeting with the association to discuss more fully the NSWMA's preference for the Johnson farm site which the group alleges poses as a direct threat to the Wye Valley watershed.

Barrett-Hamilton, Farrell and Whittam said in their letter, "We have visited the proposed dump site and as a result, we are left with much anxiety over the potential for environmental damage to the Wye Valley watershed if the dump site does not contain materials properly."

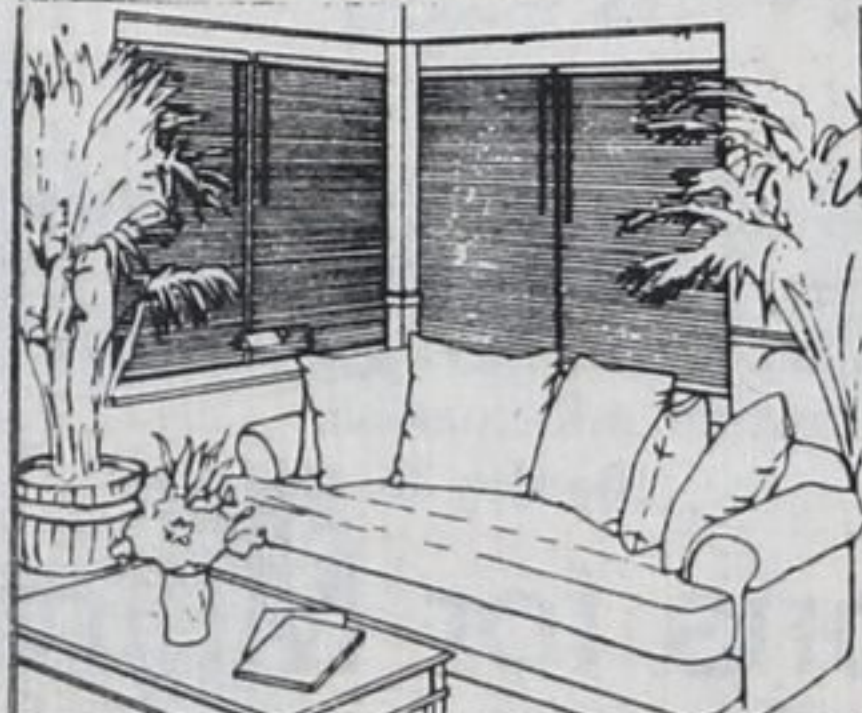
