Members of NSWMA were given a correspondence at last Tuesday evening's meeting of the association signed by John Barrett-Hamilton, general manager of the Huronia Historical Parks, Father James Farrell, director of the Martyr's Shrine and Bob Whittam, executive director of the Wye Marsh Wildlife Centre. voicing their opposition to the use of the Wayne Johnson farm in the south end of Tiny for a new landfill site.

Barrett-Hamilton, Farrell and Whittam said in their letter, "We have visited the proposed dump site and as a result, we are left with much anxiety over the potential for environmental damage to the Wye Valley watershed if the dump site does not contain materials properly."

The letter explained the dump site and the peripheral areas to the northeast are extremely wet in some seasons and in the planned technology for water retention fails or is inadequate, waste materials could reach the Wye Valley very quickly as nearby streams feed directly into the Wye River.

Officials from the three major tourist attractions in the Midland area asked the NSWMA to consider alternatives to this new dump site for economical and environmental reasons.


