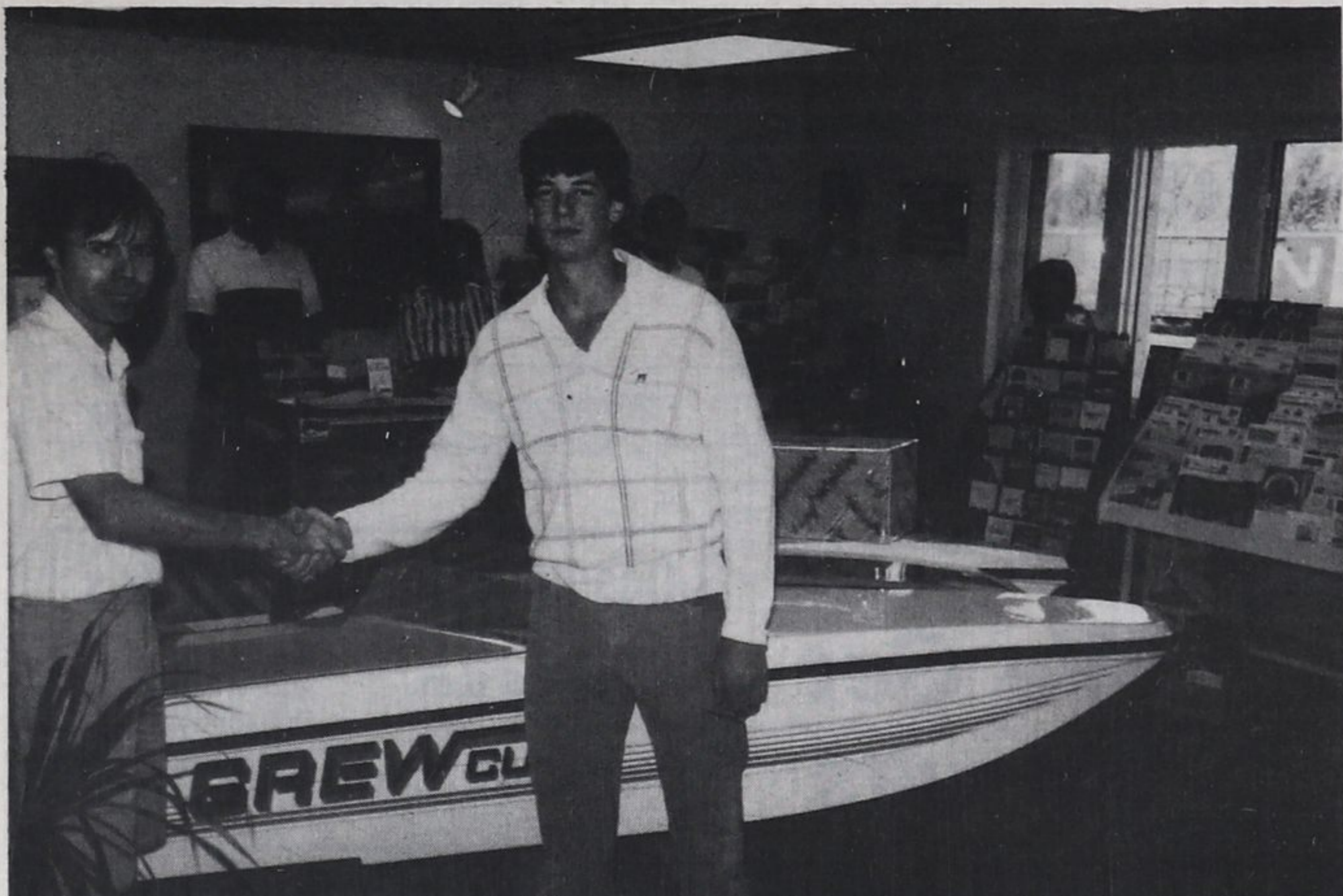

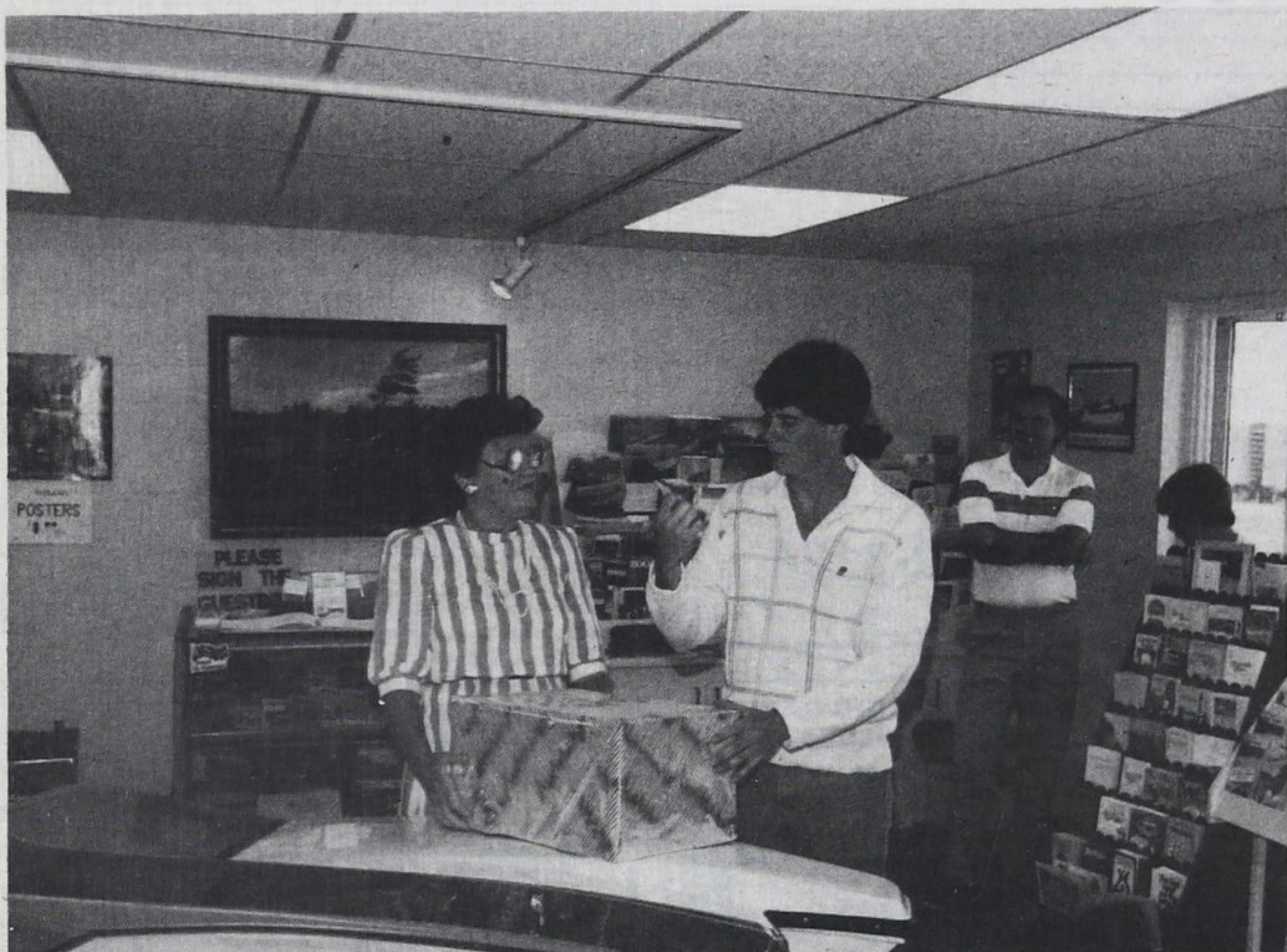

## Midland Chamber boat winner announced

The Midland Chamber of Commerce has announced the winner for this year's Grew Boat draw. Lorne Pinkney, of 318 Fourth Street in Midland, will take home the prize of a new boat valued at over \$2,000 after Chamber officials drew his ticket number from a barrel of 13,000 others. Pinkney held lucky ticket number 18437.

About \$3,600 was netted by the Chamber which will be used to help offset the amount needed to complete Phase II of the building campaign of the Chamber building located at the foot of King St.

Chamber Manager Matt Parry said, although the money raised through the boat draw is a "good healthy chunk of what was needed", the fund is still a fair distance away from the

cost of completing Phase II.

"We are still looking for major contributions from companies who have not yet supported the campaign."

Approximately \$50,000 is needed for the finishing touches to accent the new building. The goal of Phase II is to add a screened pavillion which will serve as a tourist information centre in the summer and as a storm defence in the winter, a ceremonial deck overlooking the bay, a paved walkway, a lighted sign and a flagpole. The chamber is looking to

achieve their Building Fund Campaign goal of \$185,000 by the end of the year. Parry said that a major campaign drive will be held during the fall in an effort to raise the last amount of money needed to reach its goal, but said that specific details on the campaign are still being ironed out.

The winner of the most tickets sold went to Stew Gervan of Gervan and Associates. He sold 20 books of tickets, or 400 individual tickets. Gervan received a 12-speed bike for his contribution to the success of the draw.
