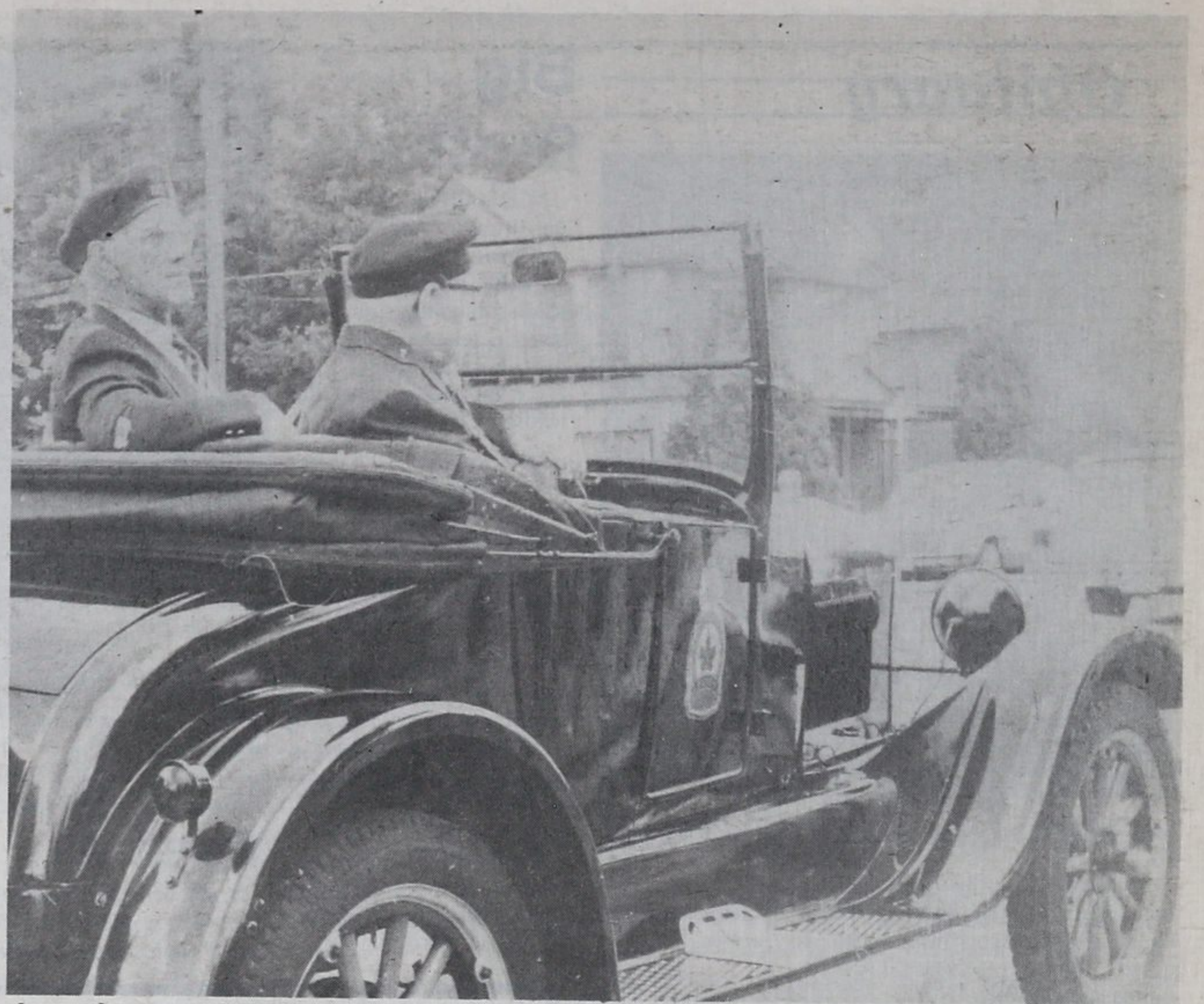




Fair goer

Friday, September 26, 1986, marks the first Film Night of our new season. Be sure to bring the kids for fine family entertainment. The show starts at 7:15 p.m.

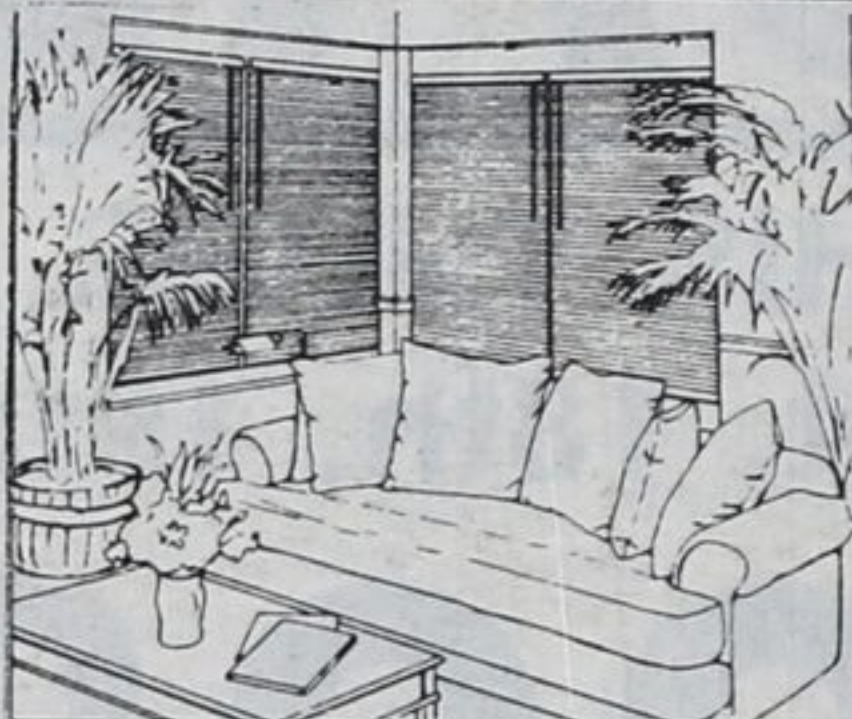
Story Hour and Family Film Night are absolutely free.

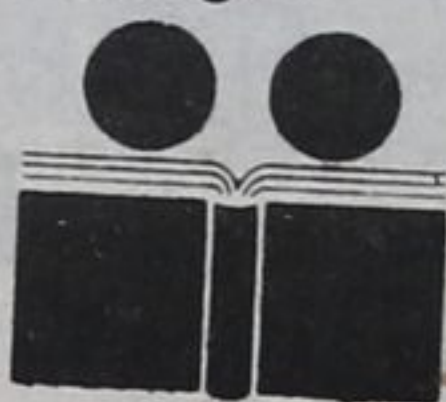
