

Terry Fox run comes to an end

A lack of interest has cancelled this year's Terry Fox Run in Midland. According to personnel manager, Beverly King, of K-Mart an official sponsor of the run, not enough people expressed interest in the event to hold one this year.

The event, which was

scheduled to take place Sept. 14, is still on as scheduled in other parts of the province, says King and the K-Mart store in Midland is suggesting that interested runners attend the Barrie Terry Fox Run.

This year is not the first year that K-Mart in Midland has sponsored the

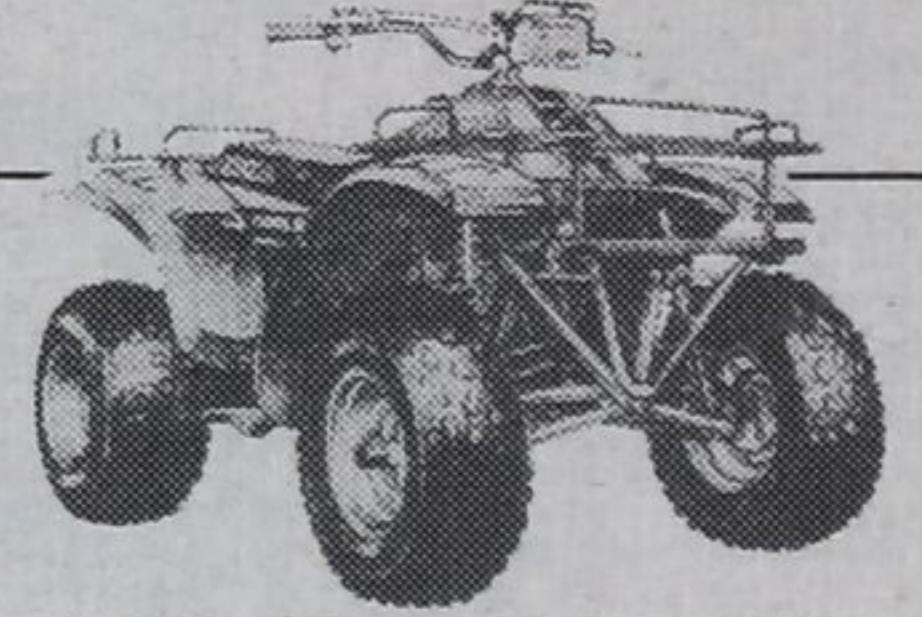
run and has failed to get enthusiastic response. Last year, although the run was not cancelled, only 25 entrants ran the 10 kilometre course. This year however, well into the campaign, only one person phoned in to show interest in the event.

King admits, however, that after it was determin-

ed the run would be cancelled, a number of interested people approached K-Mart to sign up for the charitable event. King said she referred them to the Barrie run.

Across Canada hundreds of K-Mart head office and

store management and staff have gone into training to prepare for their participation in the run. K-Mart hopes to reach or surpass last year's \$125,000 which they raised through pledges and donations.

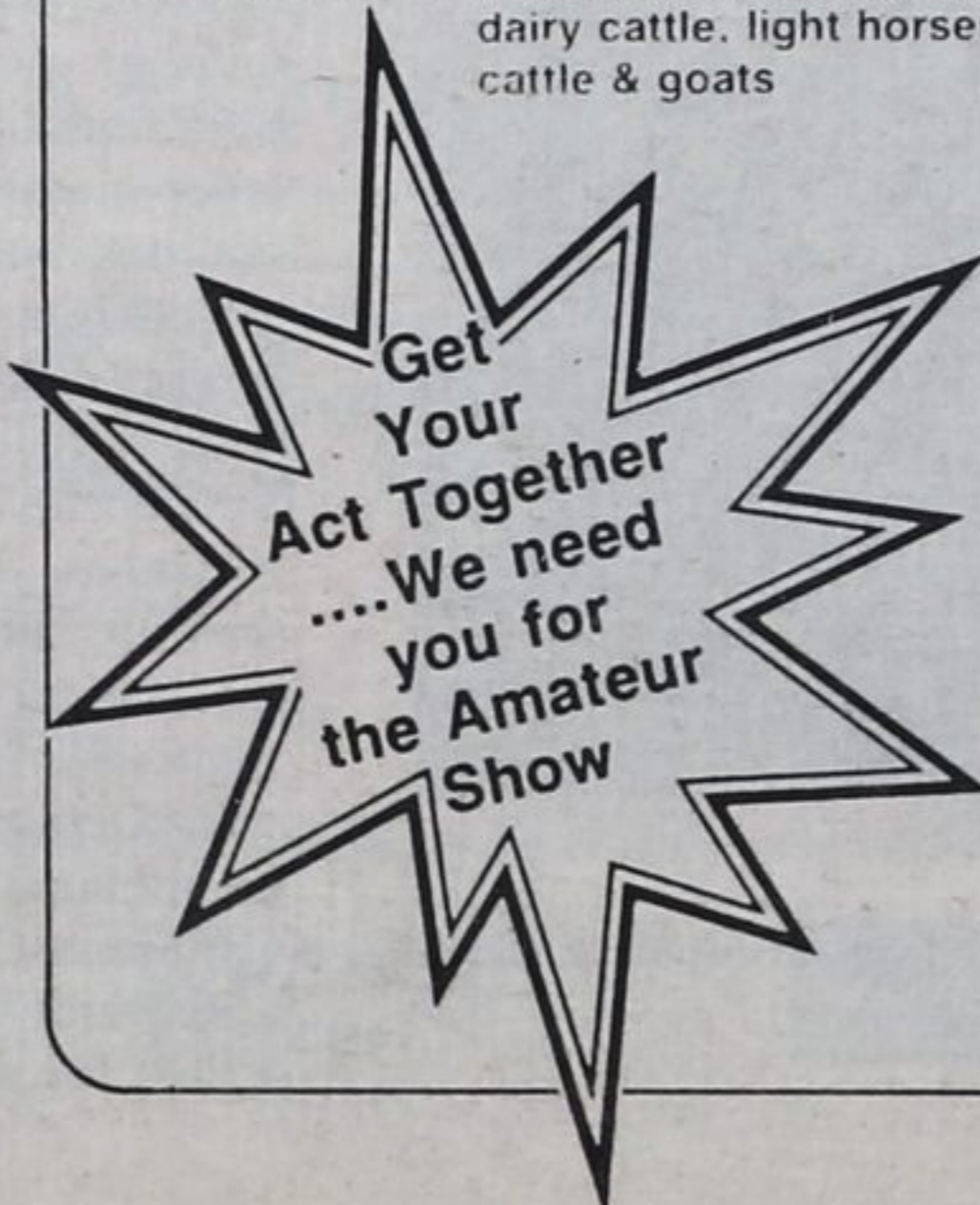
