Midland's Schmidt finishes top 10

Gunther Schmidt came from 20th spot to finish ninth Sunday at Mont Tremblant in the Canadian Racing Championships. Schmidt, who came down with the flu on Wednesday and Thursday, experienced some more bad luck in the qualifying round on Saturday. Go-

ing around the track at about 180 kph on a wet and slick track the volkswagen rabbit hit a guard rail and crashed causing an estimated \$2500 in damages to the vehicle. However, Schmidt worked through the night along with his brother to repair the damages well enough

to race on Sunday. It took the pair 25 hours to get the vehicle in racing condition. The rear axel was bent, two fenders were severely damaged and had to be repaired with racing tape, two wheels were broken, and the front suspension was out of whack. Schmidt, for his part, was virtually unhurt in the scary crash, but did suffer some whiplash.

The duo finished the job 10 minutes before race time on Sunday, only to find that the car was not running properly after all their efforts. But it was too late to make any other adjustments; Schmidt had to drive it the way it was. The rear wheel was on an angle, making the car virtually steer itself around the corners. Schmidt started 20th out of 28 cars and made it to ninth with an average speed of 130 kilometers per hour. The winner, from Sur-

rey, B.C., averaged 136.025 kph, totally outclassing the field. The favourite in the race, last year's winner Jacques Bienvenue, of St. Jean Baptiste, finished just seconds ahead of Schmidt in eighth place in a Scirocco.

In practise on Friday, Schmidt registered the seventh best time overall on the very challenging course.
