John Leitch steps down as chairman of the board of governors of Georgian College at the end of this year. He has reached the limit of time he can sit on the board.

The Midland industrialist was a member for four years on the college's technical advisory board.

Each area served by the college is represented on the board of governors by a person from that area. Robbert Hartog preceded Leitch on the board.

During Leitch's association with the college, Georgian College has become the number one teaching college in Canada in the area of tourism; one of the top colleges in Ontario in the area of health sciences; and the location

of the Canadian Automotive Institute, which has classes for francophones as well as anglophones.

The college has improved its offering in the area of computer training, running computers, programming computers, using up-to-date design and manufacturing instruction.

The Canadian Tourist Management Centre is a new building with a convention centre.

The college facilities in Barrie, Orillia, and Owen Sound have been upgraded.

New equipment for teaching masters has been purchased.

Georgian College and the province's 21 other community colleges were established in 1968.
