

was loaded; Never shoot at a sound.

See your target clearly first; Never point a gun at anything you don't intend

to kill;

Exercise muzzle control of the firearm by knowing where the gun is pointed at all times;

Unload all guns when you return to camp;

Never fire a gun which has a plugged barrel;

Never carry a loaded gun in a vehicle;

Never bring a loaded gun him. indoors:
