# Outlaws continue winning streak

The E&R Discount Outlaws improved their record to 5 - 0 - 1 for 11 points in first place as they romped over the OPSEU Terminators by a score of 37 - 1. Morris Robitaille picked up 12 points on two majors from Q.B. Mike Hamelin to improve his stats to 62 points. Kent Goldsmith became a receiver overnight as he hauled in three majors on some nice catching ability. Peter Robillard snagged a Mike Hamelin pass and scrambled over the goal line for 6 points. Ray Gaudouray picked up a single point conversion to hold him in sixth spot on the scoring ladder with 25 points. The OPSEU Terminators held off the Outlaws until the end of the first quarter as the defence played tight and kept them off the board. The Terminator offence romped up and down the field with pride as Q.B. Bob Hirst and Fred Sisilak threw several nice passes to their receivers for first down yardage. They scrimmaged from the 6, 5, 15 and 1 yard lines but could not dominate on receptions for any majors. Doug Waugh, Sisilak and Hirst picked up a lot of yardage to gain decent field positions but came up short. Fred Sisilak picked up the

## Twelve hunting tips for fall trip

Planning a hunting trip this fall? If so, the Ontario Provincial Police remind you that no hunting trip is a success if it isn't first a safe hunt. Here's the OPP's 12 point safety checklist:

- Treat every gun as if it was loaded;
- Never shoot at a sound. See your target clearly first;
- Never point a gun at anything you don't intend to kill;
- Exercise muzzle control of the firearm by knowing where the gun is pointed at all times;
- Unload all guns when you return to camp;
- Never fire a gun which has a plugged barrel;
- Never carry a loaded gun in a vehicle;

Never bring a loaded gun indoors;

Unload the fire-arm

before climbing fences, jumping ditches or walking through dense bush;

Never fire at rocks or water as a ricochet bullet can go anywhere;

Wear highly visible clothing and not camouflage outfits;

Drinking and hunting don't mix. A hangover is a deadly form of impairment.

Hunting can be a safe sport if you recognize and avoid the potential dangers. Hunters, in pursuit of game, can become lost in the bush. Carry a compass and know how to use it. The OPP recommends that if a hunter discovers he is lost he should "hug a tree" and wait for searchers to find him.

Before leaving on a hunting trip tell someone

where you are going and then go there. Numerous searches have been carried out for lost and overdue hunters who said they were going one place but went another.

Hunters who boat to their hunting area have the double responsibility of remembering the rules of

boating. An overloaded boat is likely to capsize, throwing its heavily-dressed occupants into freezing water. A lifejacket that is worn is a real lifesaver in this situation.

All hunters should carry a basic first-aid kit and know the fundamentals of first-aid.
