Redskins trounce Mick B's Renegade 36-0

The first game at MSS saw the Hydro Hawks defeat the OPSEU Terminators by a score of 32 - 6. The Terminators put up a good defensive effort as the Hawks didn't start scoring big until the second half. It also didn't help the Terminators as they played with only seven men against the Speedy Hawk offense led by Helmsman, Peter Maracle. Jerry McBride hauled in a 25 yard pass on a toss from QB Ken Wright for the only Terminator major. The Terminators had lots of opportunities to score but couldn't dominate on third downs. Doug Waugh and Bill Beauchamp picked up lots of yardage on nice receptions to give them good field position. 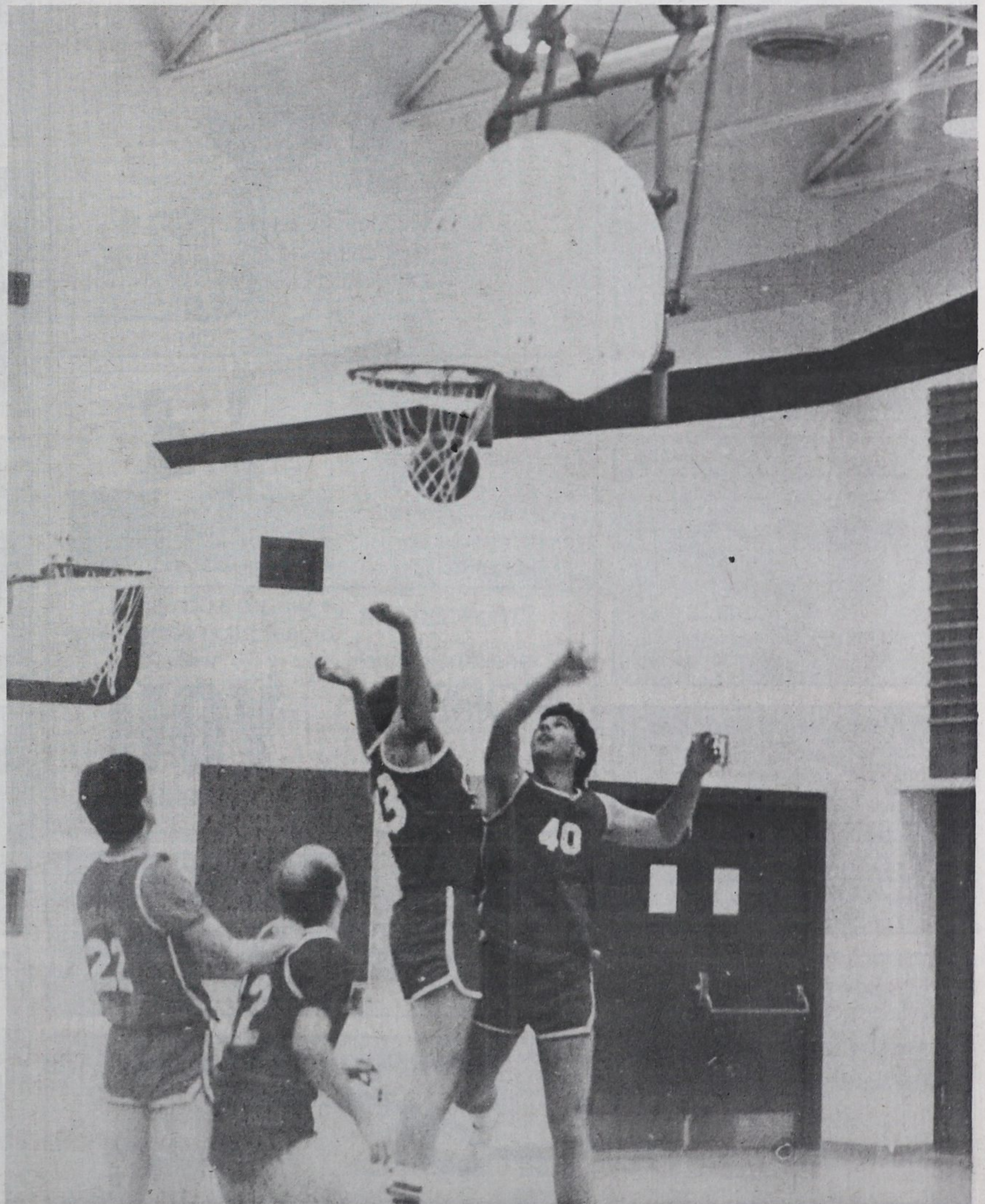
