Weekend Pee Wee league action

The Penetanguishene Driftwood Major Pee Wees completed a very successful weekend of hockey by winning one game and tying the other, their first Georgian Bay Minor Hockey Association league game of the season.

On Friday, Oct. 24 in Elmvalle, the Driftwood Pee Wees squeaked out a 2-1 victory to stretch their exhibition play record to 2 and 2. Jesse Bazinet opened the scoring at the 5:22 mark of the second period to give Penetang an early 1-0 lead. David Brooks was credited with the assist after working hard in the corner to get the puck out to Bazinet. Chris Marchildon made it 2-0 after being set up by line-mates Jesse Bazinet and Tim Mason at the 11:25 mark of the second period. Elmvalle's Joe Vanhaarhoven rounded out the scoring with only :58 seconds left in the third period to spoil the shut-out bid by Penetang goalies Scott Galt and Claude Vallee who both played well for Driftwood.

On Sunday, Oct. 26, Driftwood Pee Wees travelled to Collingwood to play their first regular season game in G.B.M.H.A. league play. The local team were a bit unorganized in the first six minutes of the game and before you could say Howie Meeker three times, Collingwood struck for three quick goals. Having their backs to the proverbial wall, Driftwood Pee Wees demonstrated character by replying with three goals of their own to tie the game just before the end of the second period. Not only did they show their offensive power, but they scored two of these goals when shorthanded! Once again, it was Jesse Bazinet who scored Penetang's first goal on a pretty pass from centreman Tim Mason who drew the assist as did Raymond Dupuis. Less than two minutes later, it was Raymond Dupuis who scored his team's second goal on a hard blast from the point after being fed the puck by David Beausoleil from the corner. Adrian Maurice made it 3-3 just minutes later as he was set up in the slot by both Billy Leonard and David Brooks. With only six seconds left in the second period, Collingwood went ahead 4-3 and took this lead into the third.

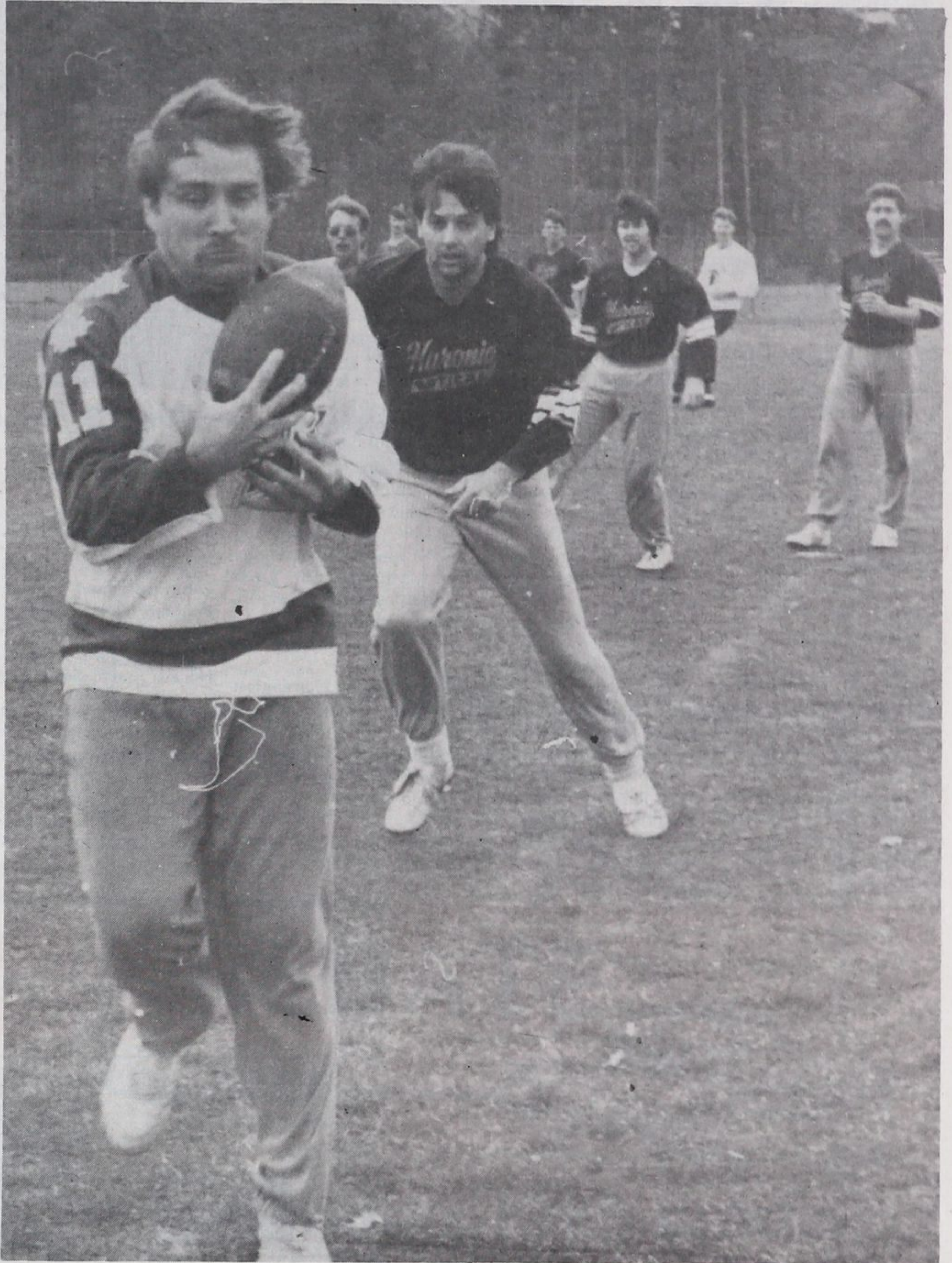
Early in the third, Driftwood's Chris Diesveld scored a well-earned goal by working hard in the cor-

ner and then when he passed it out to the slot, the puck hit the Collingwood goalie's pad and deflected into the net to tie the game at 4-4. Adrian Maurice scored his second goal of the game mid-way through the period to give Penetang its first lead of the game

with only six minutes left. Not to be outdone, Collingwood tied the score three minutes later, but it was Driftwood's Kirk Ruston who scored what appeared to be the winner with only 1:44 left on the clock. Collingwood's Tyler Lanktree tied the game at

6-6 with only 36 seconds remaining in the game after catching Penetang's rearguards up ice in the dying moments of the game. Once all the smoke had cleared, the game ended in a tie giving each team one point in the league standings after their first

outing. The Penetanguishene Driftwood Pee Wees will play an exhibition game on Saturday, November 1 in Bracebridge before playing another regular league game which will be against their rivals from Midland On Nov. 2
