## Local mall home to oriental jeweller

If you've ever wondered what the four C's of diamonds are, or wanted to learn more about stones or wanted to design your own rings, necklaces and bracelets, you'll have your chance to try.

A new jewellery store opened in the Huronia mall this Saturday. Phoenix Jewellers, run by two immigrants, could be a success story.

Gillian and Tan La say their new store is based on the open concept. They say the customer can watch his jewellery being repaired or made. He can say what he'd like as La does the work.

As well, the pricing system is Oriental say the Las. Weight is the single biggest factor in price; in other words, if a ring and a pair of earrings weigh the

same, they would likely cost the same.

In the store, the customer can see bracelets, necklaces, earrings and rings already made, but he can also find stones in little boxes, so he can pick what he'd like to go in his ring or on a pendant. La says his store is the first in the area to do this. He also said his wife handpicks

everything. Both Gillian and Tan La have come from different parts of the world. Gillian's family came from South Africa in 1967, and her

parents are teachers at Corpus Christi school in Penetanguishene. Tan came as a refugee from South Vietnam. While there, he was a lieutenant in the South Vietnamese

army and worked with American intelligence, before he became a prisoner of war.

## Group needs funds

The Midland-Penetanguishene and District Branch of the Canadian Diabetes Association (C.D.A.) needs to raise \$12,000 to continue educating people about diabetes and to continue funding research. Presently, there is no cure for diabetes.

The C.D.A. sent a letter

requesting funds to Penetanguishene Town council, but council referred it to the Administration and Finance committee.

Interestingly, the C.D.A. says it doesn't receive any grants or United Way funds, and therefore it depends on the "compassion and concern of people who care."

## Society gets grant

The Midland Horticultural Society has been given \$4,500 by the Town of Midland. The annual grant is used by the society to make the Town beautiful.

In 1986 the society planted 74 trees on town streets, and annuals, geraniums (the municipal flower), and shrubs. Flowers were placed at the Town dock, on King Street, Dominion Avenue, King Street and Yonge Street, the Senior Citizen's Club building, Huronia Museum, the YMCA, the flower bed in Little Lake Park, the two large flower beds at entrances to Midland, and the Chamber of Commerce building.
