Tax grant cheques mailed out

The Ministry of Revenue began mailing the property tax grant cheques to \$500. eligible Ontario seniors on Oct. 31, and will continue to do so each week. Seniors are required to have filled out an application to be eligible. If you have not done so, you may contact the Ministry of Revenue, 50 Grosvenor Street, Toronto, M5S 2V3, for an application.

The amount of the grant depends on the person's occupancy cost for 1986. For those that received this grant last year, the coming cheque represents the final installment of the 1986 property tax grant for seniors. The interim grant that was last spring paid represented one half of last year's total grant.


