Driftwood had several good chances in the period to tie the game, but it was not to be as the puck just couldn't find its way in to the Collingwood net.

Sweeping Seniors are still meeting for curling on Wednesdays at 1:30 p.m. Everyone welcome.

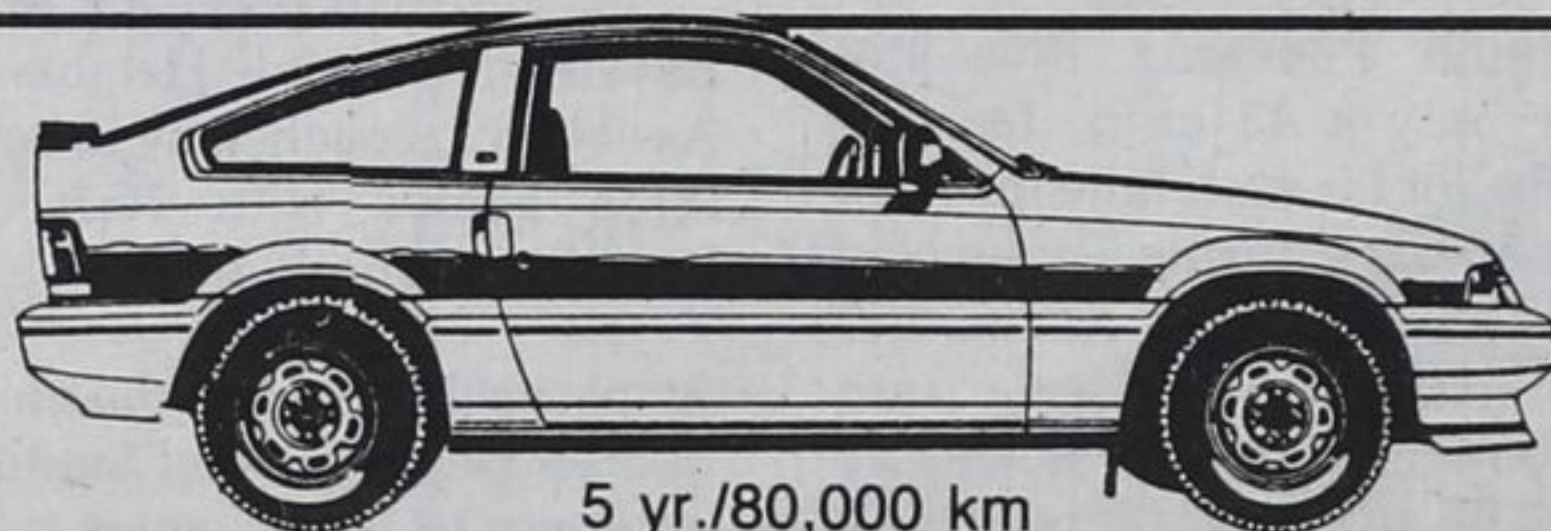
