Kamran Khozan, NSDC commissioner, expects that a recommendation will be ready for Midland council within the next two weeks.

The ideal parcel of land would be 10 to 15 acres, accessible, visible, with a good view of the surroundings, in a non-residential area but connected to all municipal services, and with a connection to commercial level 550 volt electricity.

Possibile sites for the consideration of the committee are land south and Contract east of Little Lake Park, the northeast corner of William Street and Highway 12, the area of Tiffin Park, and east and southeast of the intersection of Vinden Street and Fifth Street.

Huronia Park, above Bayshore Drive, is the only completely municipally owned land which meets most of the criteria. It is not 10 to 15 acres in area.

The NSDC, the mandate of which is job creation, is not idle in the meantime, Khozan says.
