The official description of how Const. Roden saved a man's life appears below.

"In the evening of 24 April, 1985, Constable Stephen Roden, of the Iroquois detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police, rescued an 82-year-old man trapped in the kitchen of his burning house. Constable Roden was on plainclothes assignment, operating an unmarked vehicle, when he noticed flames coming out of a residence. He stopped and, without hesitation, dashed into the building engulfed in flames. He found the disoriented man and dragged the resisting victim outside to safety. He then re-entered the house and, forced to his knees by intense smoke and heat, crawled along the hallway in search of other possible victims. Although suffering from smoke inhalation, Constable Roden satisfied himself that the house was empty before staggering

Also last week, Midland OPP Corporal W.D. (Dave) Brophey received a St. John special certificate of commendation, during an OPP award ceremony held in Barrie.


The official account reads: "On May 7, 1985, while offduty, Corporal Brophey was attending a meeting of the Midland District Shrine Club."
