Licences now available

The recent cold weather has fishermen thinking about pleasant days in warm fish huts on the ice covered lakes and rivers of our province. Anglers are repairing fish huts, buying new tackle, overhauling old gear and reading up on those tasty fish recipes.

This year anglers are reminded that they need something new. As of January 1, 1987 most residents of Ontario between the age of 18 and 64 will require a licence to fish in the province. The licences are now on sale from a network of more than 3,000 vendors across the province, including seventy issuers in the Simcoe/Dufferin County area, and most fish hut operators.

The new licence will cost \$10 for the year or \$5 for any four consecutive days and they are expected to produce as much as \$9 million in their first year of sale.

Funds equivalent to the amount generated by the licences will be spent on such activities as fish habitat rehabilitation, upgrading law enforcement, fish culture facilities, sport fish enhancement and the Community Fisheries Involvement Program.

NEW ROUTE
