Midland Jory IDA Jazz ended the regular season of the Simcoe County Men's Intermediate Basketball League on a losing note. The Jazz travelled to Barrie to play the first place Queen's Hotel in what promised to be a close game as each team vied for a chance at first place.

Queen's, playing without centre, Ben Kazimier, and all-star forward, Marty McCrone, came up with an inspired effort from the six

players present to down the visiting Jazz by eleven points 85 - 74. The game was close throughout but the home team, on the shooting arms of their guards, held the lead for the majority of the game.

Midland's dominant player, Bob Blasco, was effectively defended, and by his own admission, had one of his poorest performances of the season. The rest of his mates could not
