Performance also kept their hopes alive by dropping Top Hat Amusements 4-1. Rick Rever and Andrew Zurawski each notched a brace for Performance. Paul Hahn scored Top Hat's lone marker late in the third.

Barrelworks dashed Olympic Sports' hopes by nipping them 4-3. Scott Gordon opened the scoring for Olympia at 8:09 of the first from Wayne Dixon, but Pat Beauchamp answered for Barrelworks just over a minute later. Bill Griffin and Paul Robillard were in on the play.

Barrelworks took the lead on a goal from Robillard at 3:18 assisted by Griffin. Dave Carr knotted the score for Sports half a minute later.

After a scoreless second period, George Weatherell clicked on a play with Scott Gordon and Rick Lefaive midway in the final period. However, a pair of Barrelworks markers within 39 seconds burst the Olympia bubble. Glen South connected at 7:51 from Steve Dunn and John Weber, and Pat Beauchamp counted at 7:12 assisted by Glen Hurlehey and Paul Robillard.

Enroute to their berth in the championship final, Midland Smith Mobile nipped Bracebridge 2-1 Wednesday in the Bantam division of the eighth annual Midland Minor Hockey Association (MMHA) House League Tournament at Centennial Arena.

Backed by the stellar goaltending of Shawn Price, Smith scored in the second period on a goal by Joel Heins on a solo effort and one in the third with just 17 seconds remaining. Sean Lunnie cranked the winner with help from Gary Puddicombe and Sean Nicholson. Bracebridge notched their tally with less than a minute to go in the middle frame.
