At last Tuesday evening regular monthly meeting of the NSWMA, a motion, calling for an arbitrator to be brought in to negotiate with Tiny over their outstanding account with the association, was passed by the members.

According to Administration and Finance Chairman Nancy Keefe, over \$214,000 is owing from the township for their share of the association's budgets for 1985 and 1986.

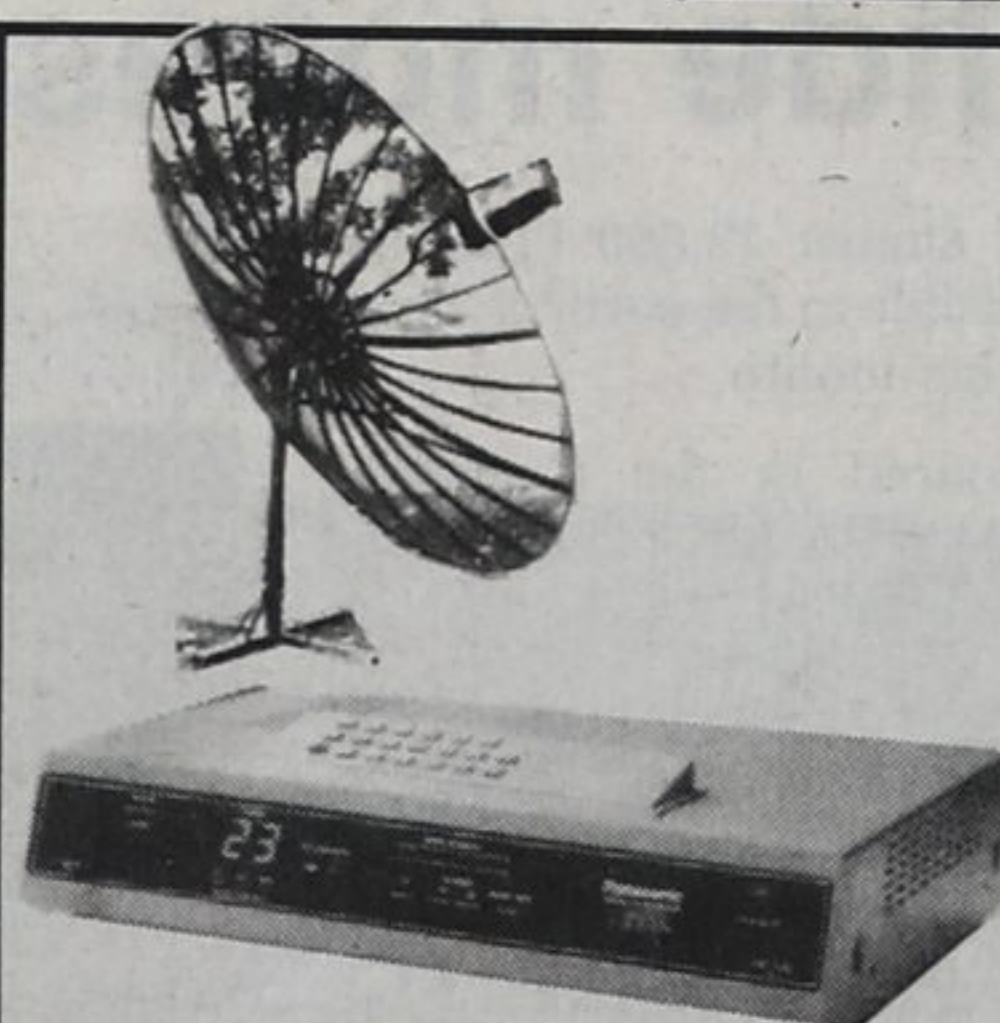
