Paradise Point will be the place for kids in the afternoon, and for the entire family after 6 p.m.

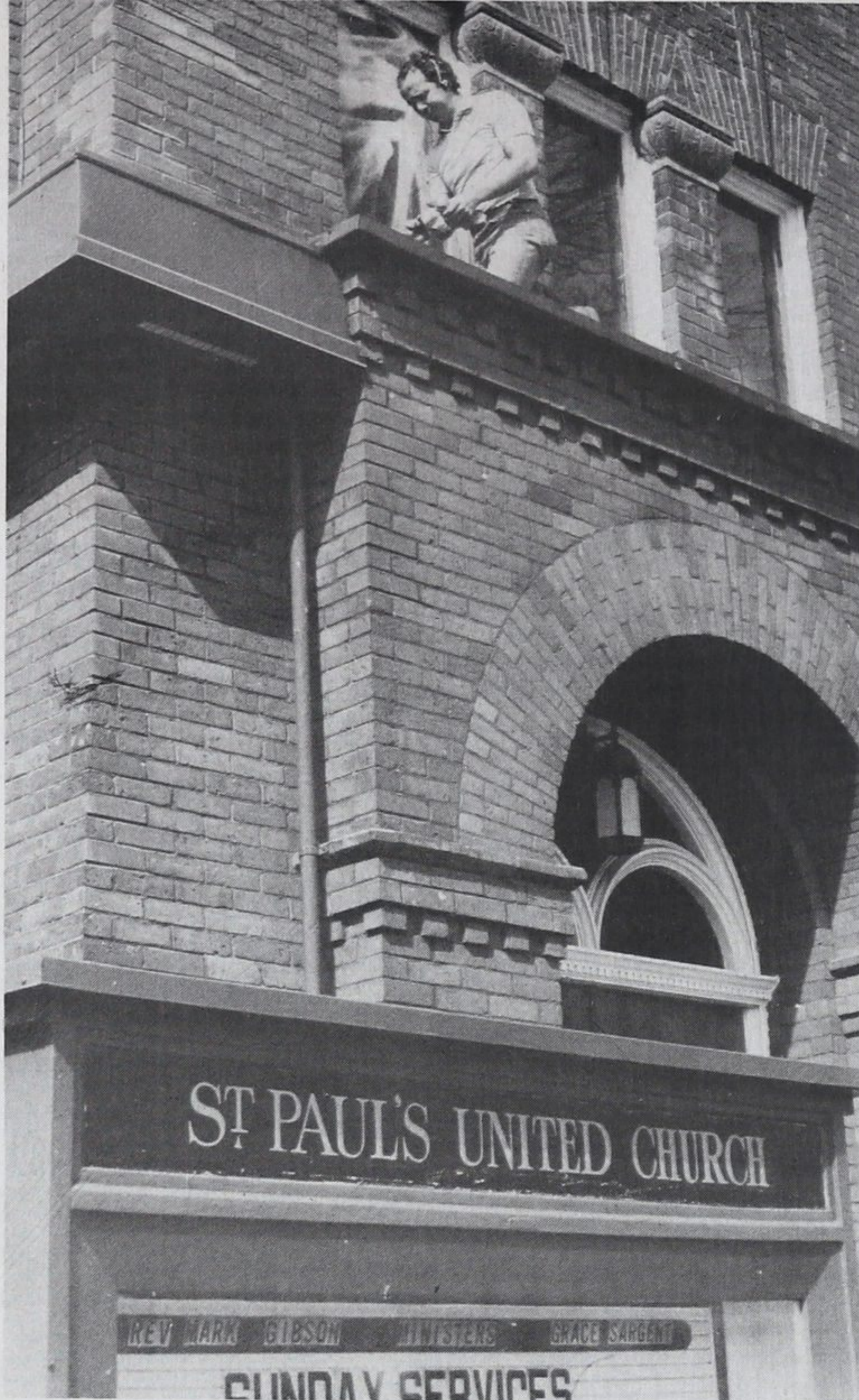
A barbecue and refreshments will be served on Paradise Point between

Waste drop-off

Tiny Township officials will be holding their second Household Hazardous Waste Day this month on Saturday at the Lafontaine Fire Hall.

According to Tiny Township Deputy-reeve Dr. Peter Brasher, township residents will be able to drop off their hazardous wastes (battery acid, drain cleaners, lighter fluid, turpentine, gasoline, poisons, bleach, pesticides, medicines, paints and cleaning fluids) at the depot being set up at the

hall between 9:30 a.m. and 1 p.m.

The first drop-off was held on April 11 at the township's road shed in Wyevalle. Although the turnout was not overwhelming, Dr. Brasher said that is to be expected in the early stages of such operations.

All substances are to be properly wrapped and labelled and carried to the site in the trunk of the vehicle.

Township officials will not accept any unknown products, commercial or industrial waste.
