Chamber to net \$12,000

The Midland Chamber of Commerce hopes to have raised enough money by this evening's end to pay for finishing the Chamber building.

A deck and stairs are planned for the front of the building. More landscaping is to be done, and, in addition, some repairs inside the building and on the adjacent parking lot.

Chamber President Brian Downer said \$12,000 is the amount the Chamber hopes will be raised. How much money will be raised is hard to predict, because such an event has not been tried here.

The Chamber enlisted the co-operation of most of the town's lawyers and more than two dozen citizens to appear on cable television yesterday evening and this evening.

Viewers pay money to either put the "criminal" in jail or set him free. Local lawyers will be the judges, defence and prosecution. Each "criminal" will be charged with a "crime" related to that person's occupation.

Dress, title cause of suspension

A teacher at Burkevale Public School suspended after her first two days says the dispute is about proper dress for a teacher, and how she is addressed by her pupils.

Neither the Penetanguishene school's principal nor the chairman of the Protestant Separate School Board had an official comment, last week.

Peg Tittle of Wendake Beach was hired in January to teach music, two mornings a week. Her choice of clothing, cotton pants and a sweat shirt, and her wish that her students call her Peg, were unacceptable to the administration, she says. "I think that I should be able to wear jeans as well."

The Federation of Women Teachers Association of Ontario has not been supportive, she says.

She was told she was being irrational and unreasonable. A grievance officer with the organization ended a telephone conversation with her by hanging up, she says.

"I am not saying that I'm necessarily right." The details of the dispute need to be known and discussed, she says. "The community may think that [her suspension] is a good decision." She believes that her contract expires in June. The school board has not tried to fire her, she says.

School board chairman Oscar Ross says that the matter is in the hands of the board's lawyer.

Tittle says that she tried to inform parents by distributing to Burkevale students a letter to be taken home. Principal Clara Piotrowski stood beside her on the sidewalk and asked students who accepted a copy of Tittle's letter to give it to her, Tittle says.

Tittle wrote a letter to the board saying that she would comply with the board's policy. In the middle of March, she filed a formal grievance letter, when she did not get a response, she says.
