The North Simcoe Arts Council NSAC has held two meetings of the ad hoc literary committee. The goal of the arts council is to form a permanent literary committee to run programs for people interested in any aspect of literature.

all styles of prose and poetry from all cultural backgrounds, inter-mixed with art and photography. The council is now seeking sources to fund the journal.

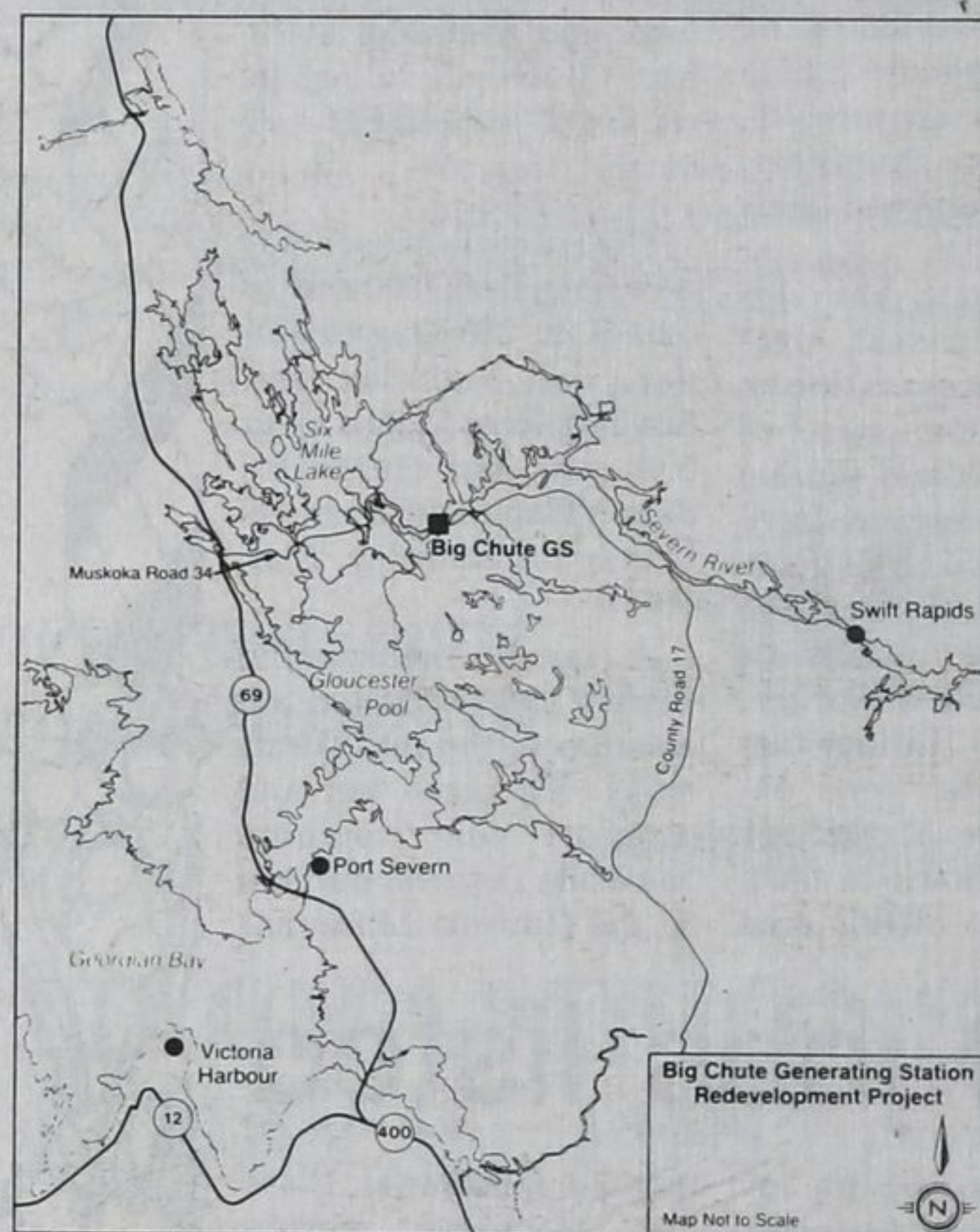
The committee is looking to expand its membership of volunteers and programs. So come out and get involved.

## STUDY ANNOUNCEMENT

### Environmental Assessment Act, 1975 Big Chute Generating Station (GS) Redevelopment



Ontario Hydro is conducting an environmental study on the redevelopment of the existing Big Chute GS, on the Severn River (see map). The generating station was built in 1909. An additional unit was added in 1916 and today the station has an output of 4 MW. Once the proposed redevelopment is complete, the station is expected to have an output of 12 MW. The new powerhouse will be built on the site of the existing building and will be about half the size.

All studies on the project will be conducted in accordance with the requirements of The Environmental Assessment Act, and will include technical, environmental, and economic aspects of the redevelopment project.

Members of the public will have an opportunity to review and comment on study information during the study process.

The results of the environmental assessment will be documented and submitted to the Ministry of the Environment. Construction is targeted to begin in 1990 with an in-service date of 1992.
