M.P. speaks to local Grits

Prime Minister Brian Mulroney may be playing with fire with the Meech Lake constitutional accord, Sudbury MP Doug Frith told a Liberal meeting in Midland last week.

Over 100 local Liberals gathered at the Midland legion to hear Frith speak about the accord (a major constitutional change which makes concessions to Quebec) at the Simcoe North Liberal meeting last Tuesday.

Frith also spoke about the way some federal Liberals had reacted to the accord.

And also at the meeting, a new executive was elected for the Simcoe North Liberals, including Alan Martin, the new president.

Frith said the Meech Lake document should be studied carefully before it's carved in stone. He said he was afraid the wording might be too vague and could be interpreted a number of different ways by the courts.

"I'm not sure if Mulroney knows what he is doing," Frith, an ex-cabinet minister, told the Times before the speech. "But he had better be careful."

Frith commented on the resignation of Liberal MP Don Johnston from his position as external affairs critic for the Liberals.

"I respect his decision," he said, "but it doesn't help in rebuilding the party. It is important right now to give a united face."

The re-elected director of the association, George MacDonald, called Johnston's actions "healthy for the party."

"It's not a negative thing at all," he said.

MacDonald also said some of the optimism of the provincial Liberals is

rubbing off on the federal short of predicting a riding in the next federal association. But he stopped Liberal victory in this election.
