Bagpipes

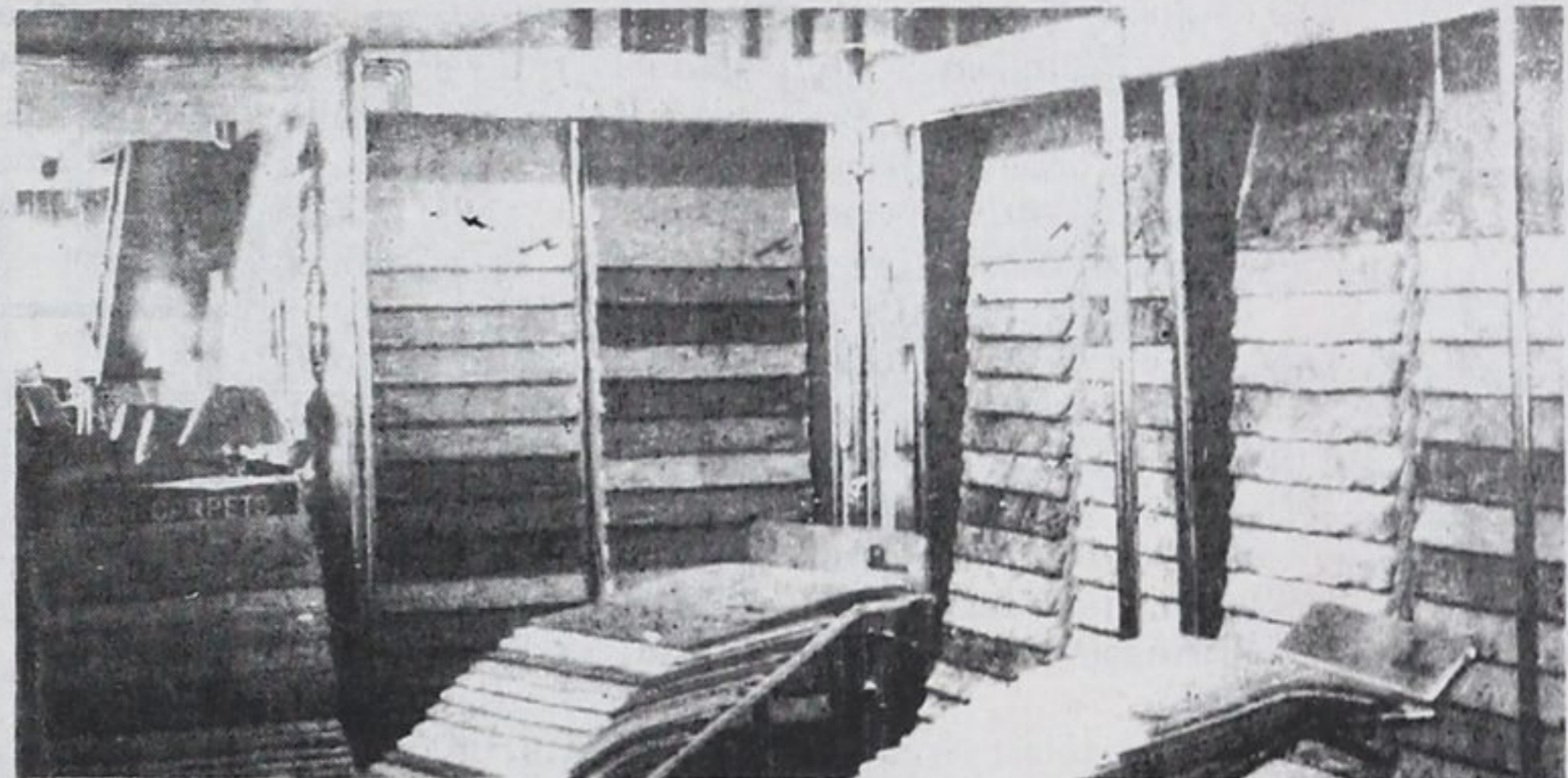
The pipes were a-blarin' in the Porterama parade Saturday. Two marching bands entertained the crowd as the parade rolled down First Street.
