Although the lads lost both contests, they played well which is all coaches Brent Cudmore and Brian Leary expect.

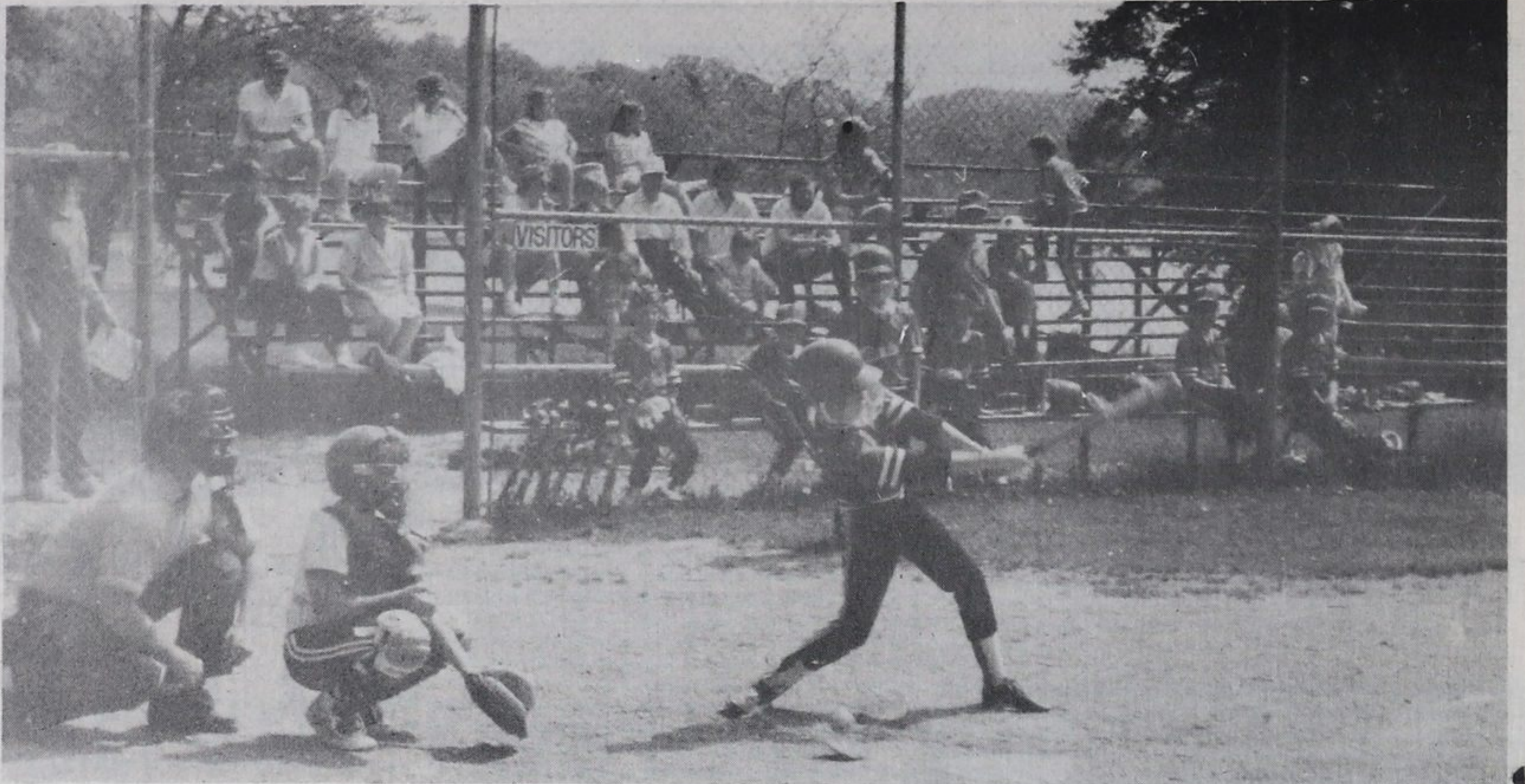
