Leaders and members of 14 area 4-H clubs gathered at Midland Secondary School on May 19 for their spring 1987 achievement program.

Surviving with Style was the title of the spring project. Surviving with Style is a 4-H project which teaches the skills needed to live happily and safely: simple home repairs, basic cooking, mending, house-keeping, car and bicycle maintenance, travel, wise buying, and other skills.

Sprinkled among the young women at the meeting were young men. Linda Caldwell Lord, rural

organization specialist with the Elmvale office of the Ministry of Agriculture and Food, said that young men are not interested usually in 4-H courses. The Surviving with Style course offered information of interest to young men, too, she said.

Town supports change

An application to change the zoning of some land on south King Street to permit the construction of a two-storey professional office building was given the support of Midland's committee of council last Wednesday to hold public hearings on planning matters.

Ronald A. Mink,

authorized agent for 670426 Ontario Inc., submitted the application to the committee.

The land for which rezoning is being requested is on the east side of King Street, opposite the Tom Smith Chevrolet-Oldsmobile car dealership, ac-

ording to information in a memorandum addressed to the committee.

The land is zoned "highway commercial." Commercial sales in Midland are allowed only in the downtown core. Mink told the committee that a sales business needs lots of parking, and that location of such a business in downtown Midland would only aggravate the parking problem that exists.

Mayor Al Roach's opinion was that the proposed building would fit on south King Street. South King Street already has a large amount of residential development, he said.

Trike-a-thon
