PROPOSED OFFICIAL PLAN AMENDMENT

THE VILLAGE OF VICTORIA HARBOUR
ZONING BY-LAW NO. 200/87
SCHEDULE "Z" MAP 4

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Victoria Harbour will hold a public meeting on Thursday June 25, 1987 at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers at the Municipal Offices, Albert and William Streets, to make available adequate information to the public regarding, and to consider a proposed Official Plan amendment under sections 17 and 21 of the Planning Act, 1983 as amended.

PURPOSE OF THE AMENDMENT is (1) to provide for a proposed future development on Village and abutting properties, for a portion of those lands designated as 'Special Study Area' (section 9.4.2), by deleting the lands indicated by cross hatching on the sketch included herewith from the Special Study Area and to retain the "Residential" designation currently applicable. The effect of this change will be to delete the requirement of a formal secondary plan for the subject property. No change is proposed to the remainder of the Special Study Area - (2) to expand and clarify section 1.5.5.1 to require that all new development or buildings, except in the designated "Partially Serviced Areas", shall be connected to full municipal services of hydro, municipal water and sanitary sewers and have frontage on an opened and municipally maintained public road.

ANY PERSON may attend the public meeting and make written or oral representation either in support of or in opposition to the proposed Official Plan amendment. If you are unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the meeting and should include a request for further notification, if so desired.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION relating to the proposed Official Plan amendment is available for inspection at the Municipal Office during regular business hours between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.
