PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO ZONING BY-LAW 106-1983

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Village of Victoria Harbour will hold a public meeting on Thursday June 25, 1987 at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers at the Municipal Office, Albert and William Streets, to make available adequate information to the public regarding, and to consider a proposed Zoning By-Law 106-1983 amendment under section 34 of The Planning Act as amended.

PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT is to change the zone classification for the lands indicated by cross hatching on the sketch included herewith from 'H' Holding to 'H-R2' Holding Residential Second Density. This change identifies the future development type for this area as residential R2 but still retains the holding provisions to retain control over the timing of any development. This insures that the future development is deemed suitable by Council and;

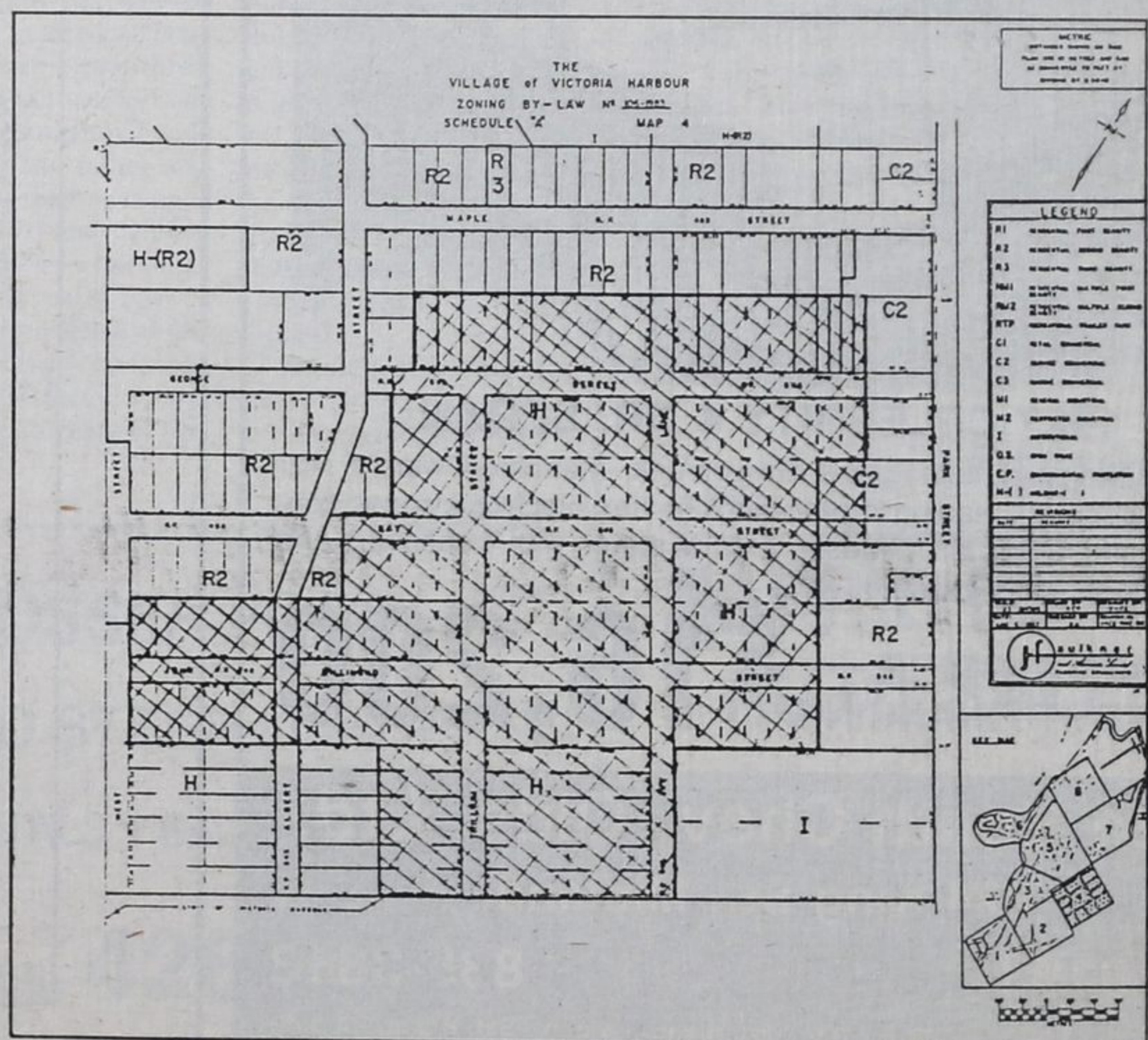
- i) is in accordance with the designation and policies of the Official Plan, and
- ii) the use permitted by such zoning will not exert adverse effect upon any adjacent existing use, and
- iii) will not jeopardize future development in conformity with the Official Plan, and
- iv) all services deemed necessary are or will be provided.

ANY PERSON may attend the public meeting and make written or oral representation either in support of or in opposition to the proposed Zoning By-Law amendment. If you are unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the meeting and should include a request for further notification, if so desired.

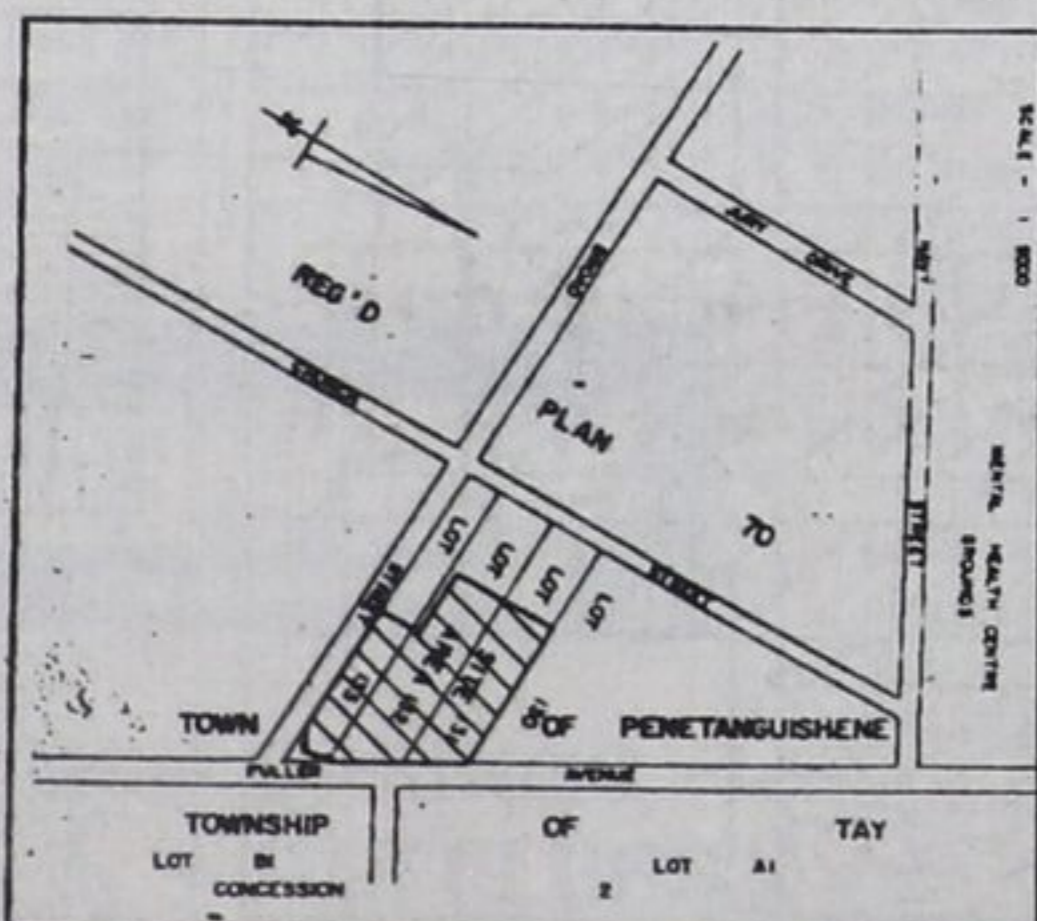
PUBLIC MEETING CONCERNING A PROPOSED ZONING BY-LAW AMENDMENT

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Penetanguishene will hold a public meeting on Thursday, June 25, 1987 at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers of the Penetanguishene Municipal Offices to consider a proposed zoning by-law amendment under Section 34 of the Planning Act, 1983.
