# Teachers get new contract

The Simcoe County 1987, \$90 per day; Board of Education and the Occasional Teachers (supply teachers) who work in the English secondary language schools have ratified a first Collective Agreement.

The agreement took place May 15, 1987 and will expire on December 31, 1989.

The supply teachers were certified under the Labour Relations Act in October 1986 by the Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation.

Negotiations commenced in January 1987 and a memorandum of agree-27, 1987. A casual occasional

teacher who holds Ministry of Education of Ontario Certification will be paid as follows:

a) Effective May 15,

b) Effective September 1, 1987, \$95 per day;

c) Effective January 1, 1988, \$105 per day;

d) Effective January 1, 1989, \$115 per day.

The current rate of pay for casual occasional teachers is \$85.03 per day and this rate has been in effect since 1981.
