Angela Schmidt Foster recorded the fastest lap time on the female side with a clocking of 14:25, trailed by Louise McKenzie of the Mac Attacks (a mixed team), with 14:45.

The General Manager of Ernst Leitz Canada Limited, Mr. Hans Witt, officially started the race and also presented the prizes valued at over \$400 after the finish. McKenzie, incidently recorded the third fastest time in the first lap.

The winning team took slightly less than an hour to complete the course, while the team finishing last ran the course in an hour and a half. No one dropped out of the race despite the 90 degree temperatures.
