

Hospital board elects 3 new members

Of the three new members of the board of Huronia District Hospital, one was a board member who sought a second three-

year term.

The other vacancies were filled by the immediate past-president of the Auxiliary to Huronia

District Hospital and a principal of Midland Secondary School, was re-elected after explaining that during the past three

years he found understand-

ing the day-to-day management of a hospital was more complex than he anticipated.

"If Huronia District

Hospital is not the best hospital now, it will be," he said.

Cathy Martin has been a volunteer and an auxiliary

since 1980. As the president of the auxiliary, she represented it on the 20-member board and is now a member of the capital campaign fundraising committee. In her election speech, she said she sees a role for herself as a patient-advocate.

Kathy Gordon (who was nominated from the floor) as well as being involved with Huronia Performing Arts for Children since its founding 10 years ago, has been involved for eight years with the Simcoe County Arts and Crafts Association, and for six years with Telecare Midland. Gordon was nominated by a past chairman of the board of HDH.

Not elected was a nominee of the nominating committee, and a second nominee from the floor.

Alex Kowalski, owner of Jory IDA Pharmacy, volunteered his knowledge as a pharmacist to the pharmacy and therapeutics committee until the hospital hired a part time pharmacist. Since he earns his livelihood from the community, he feels obliged to put money or time back into it.

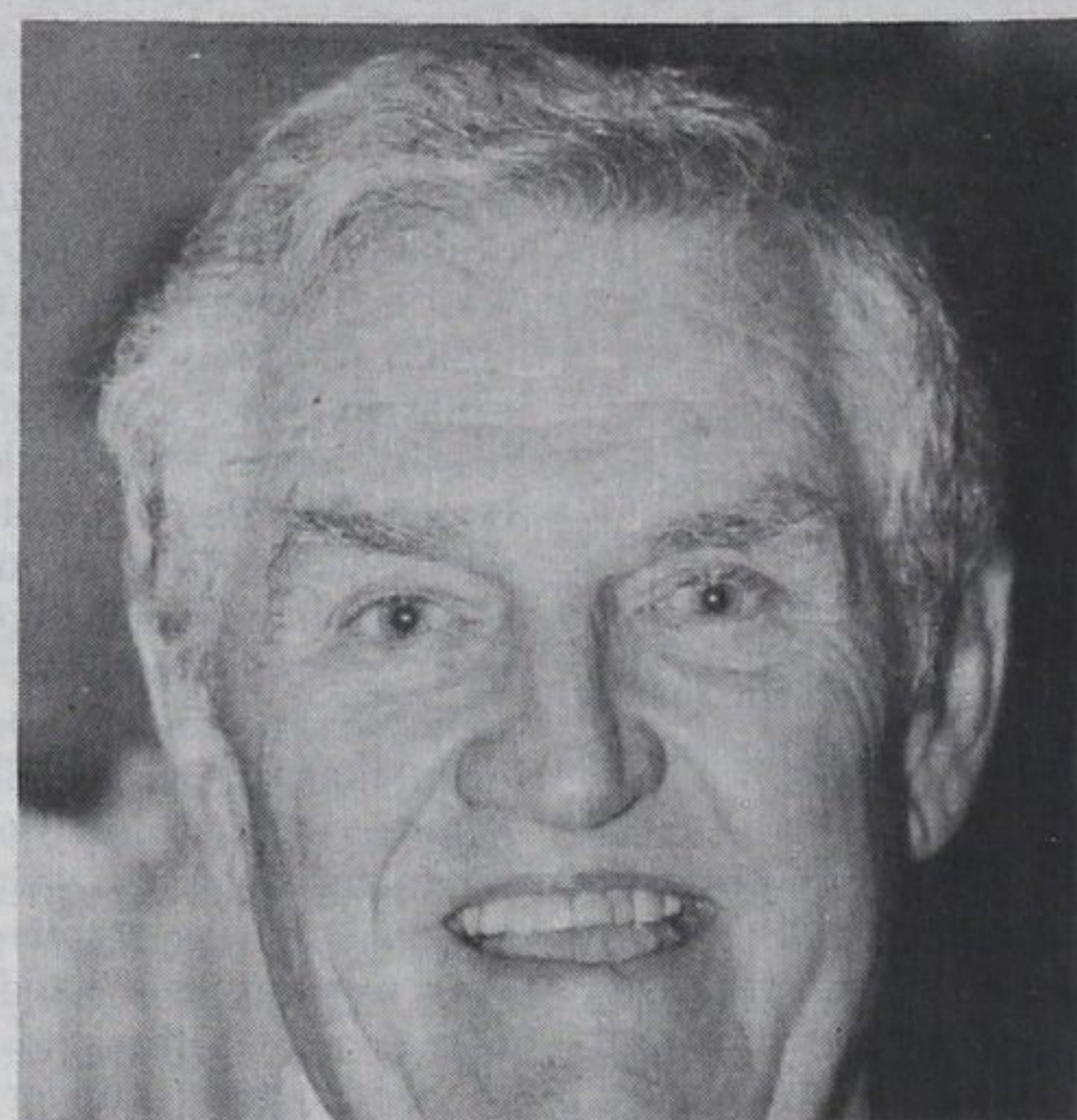

Foundation created to hold HDH funds

A foundation is being created to handle the several millions of dollars being raised to pay for improvements to Huronia District Hospital.

The purpose of creating

the foundation is to prevent the Ministry of Health from including all the money that has been raised in the campaign in its calculations when it decides what the annual

grant for the hospital will amount to. In the hospital's last fiscal year, the Ministry of Health grant accounted for more than 87 per cent of the HDH income.

Huronia District's board decided to "take action and avoid the inevitable drift to becoming a mediocre hospital" last fall.

Since government grants are not expected in the

foreseeable future for areas of the hospital which the board says need attention, it decided to raise a minimum of \$2 million on its own this year for capital

improvements. To date \$1.3 million has been raised. The board has also committed \$500,000 from a reserve fund.

Port law passed

Everyone in Port McNicoll will be affected by the newest bylaw on the village's books.

Last week the village council passed its new law spelling out exactly how everyone's property must be maintained.

For weeks council has tried to get this law on the books but has run into several hurdles. First the lawyer had to reword several sections and add a few clauses to tighten it up.

Then the village clerk realized the law was so long, it wouldn't fit in the memory banks of the computer.

But finally it was passed last Wednesday night.

And now property-owners who don't meet the village's standards can expect a visit from the bylaw enforcement officer, John Dallaire.

Dallaire will interpret sections of the law that force people to keep their property "in character" with the rest of the neighborhood.

Also, the law will affect property-owners who store unused cars and trucks on their property without licence plates.

The new law "is one of the strongest property standards bylaws in the county," said Dallaire.

Unfortunately, though, he said he will soon be taking two weeks vacation.
