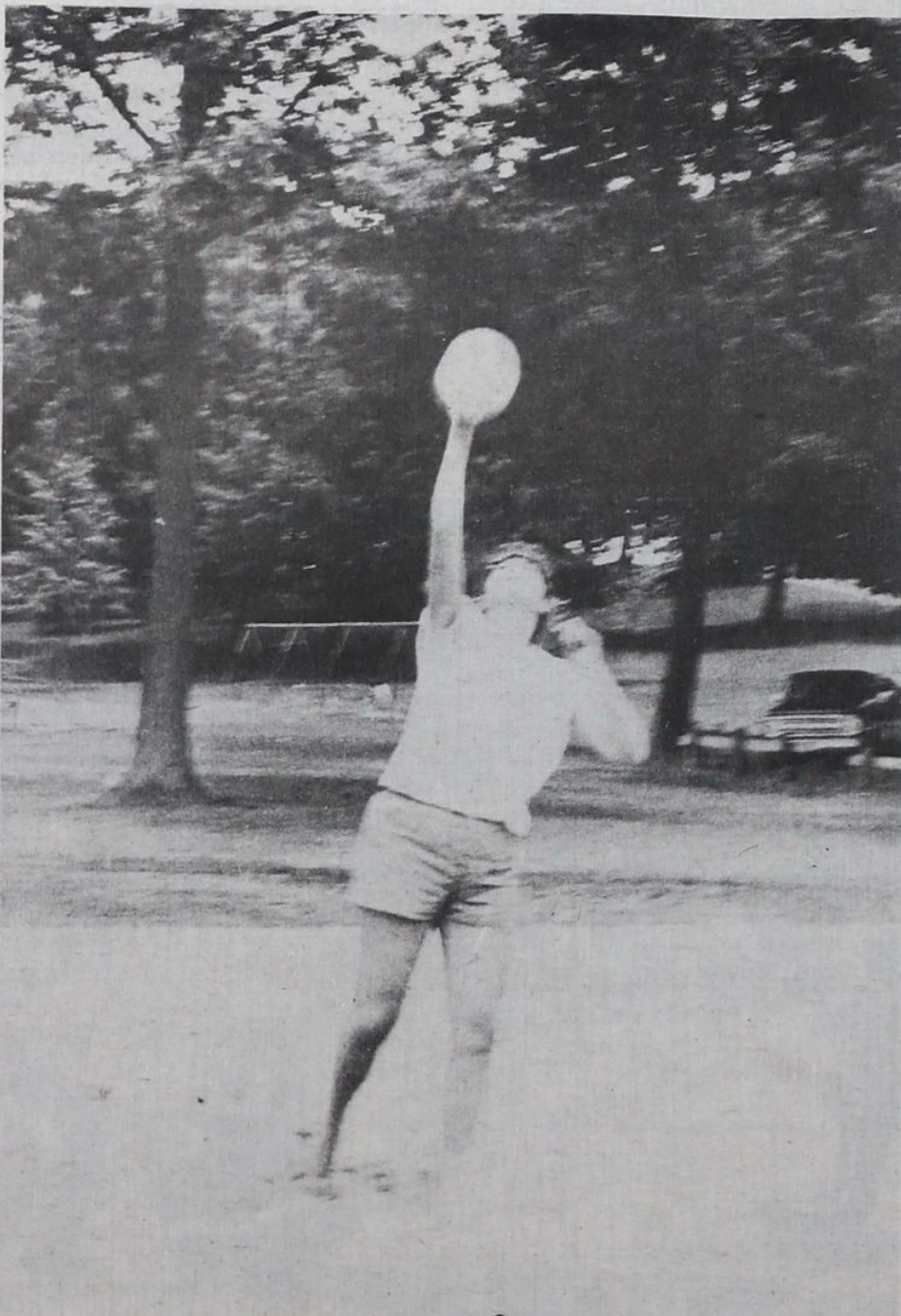
ed out a three run homer to win the game for Therrien's. For Century 21, Julie Smith did very well on first and Jay Dorion played a good solid game.
