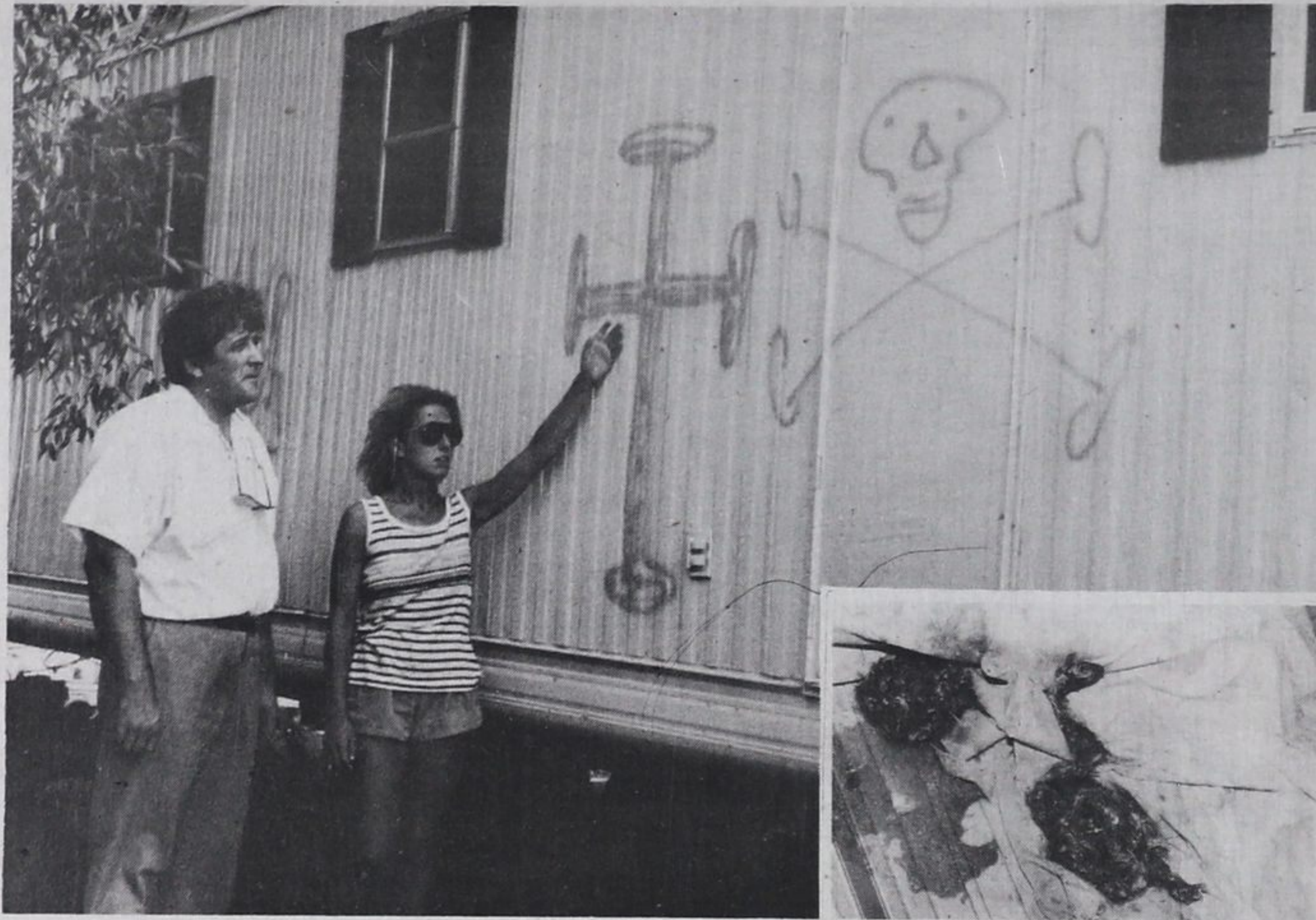

A Toronto couple found a gruesome surprise in the bedroom of their Waubaushene mobile home when they drove up for a quiet summer evening by the lake last Saturday.

When they opened the door of their trailer in the Twin Willows campground, they were greeted by the putrid smell of decaying snake-flesh.

The couple, who preferred to remain anonymous, said they had not visited their mobile home at the Highway 69 and 400 cam-

pground for more than a month.

When they arrived at the trailer Saturday, they were shocked to find someone had broken in, sprayed red paint everywhere, and left several mutilated snakes in the bed.
