Diplomat speaks at grad

The University of Toronto's Erindale Campus in Mississauga held its convocation ceremonies on June 18, conferring degrees on 642 students. The U of T's President Dr. George E.

Connell and Chancellor The Honourable John B. Aird took part in the ceremony held on the St. George Campus in Toronto. Midland resident

Christopher P. Weissflog was awarded a four-year Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Toronto. Weissflog is a former student of St. Theresa's High School in Midland.

Canadian poet-diplomat Robert A.D. Ford, former Canadian ambassador to Moscow (1964-80), received an Honorary Degree of Doctor of Laws, honoris causa. Following the conferring of his Honorary Degree Mr. Ford delivered the convocation address.

In his remarks to the graduates, their families and friends, Ford spoke of

his career in the diplomatic corps which began in 1940 as a member of the External Affairs Department eventually serving as Canadian ambassador in Cairo and Belgrade as well as Moscow. He made reference to life in the Soviet Union and in particular to modern day Russia under Gorbachev and the new "open door policy".

Following Ford's address, President Connell presented the graduates to Chancellor Aird, who in turn conferred degrees and awarded certificates.

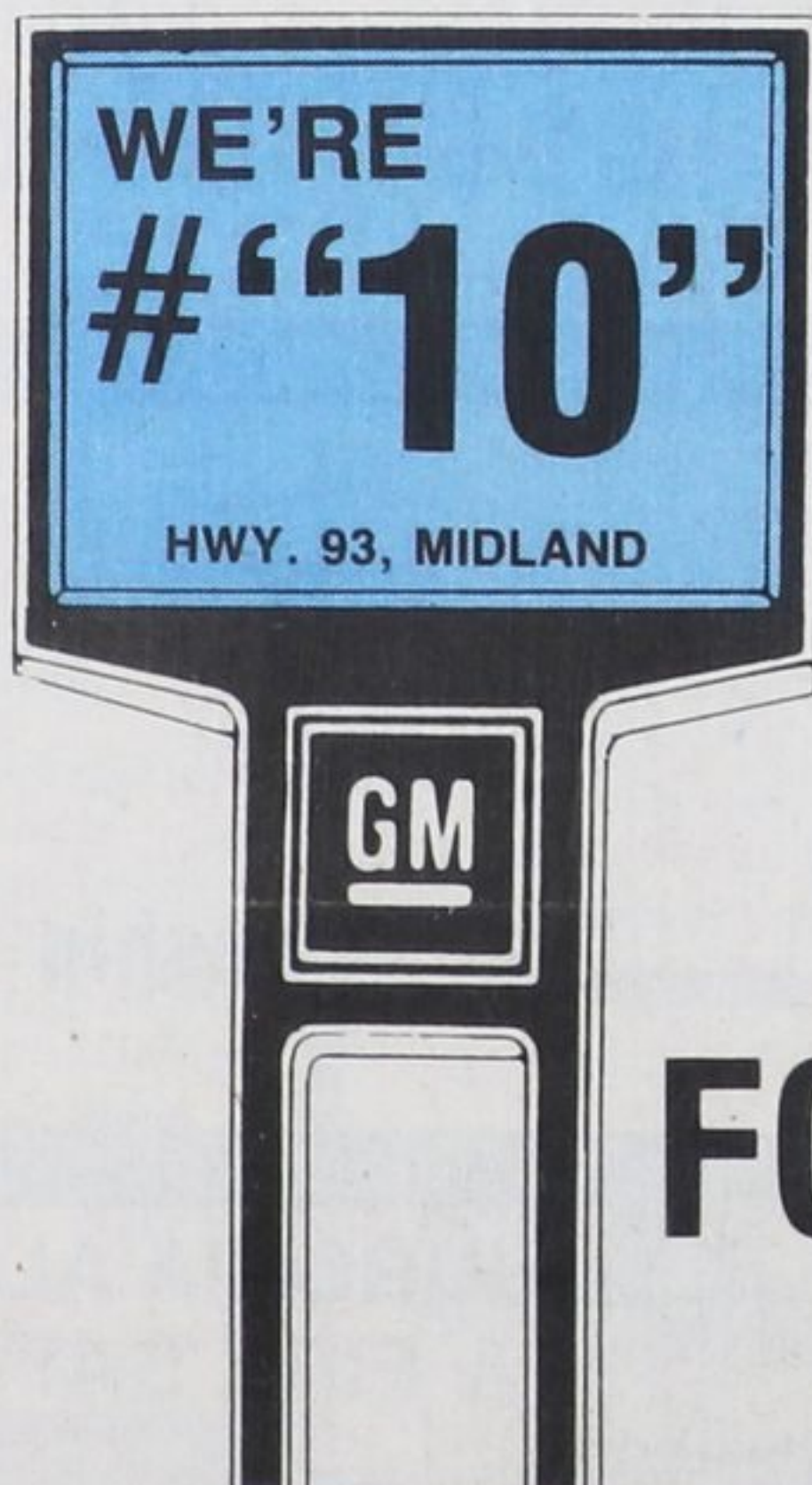
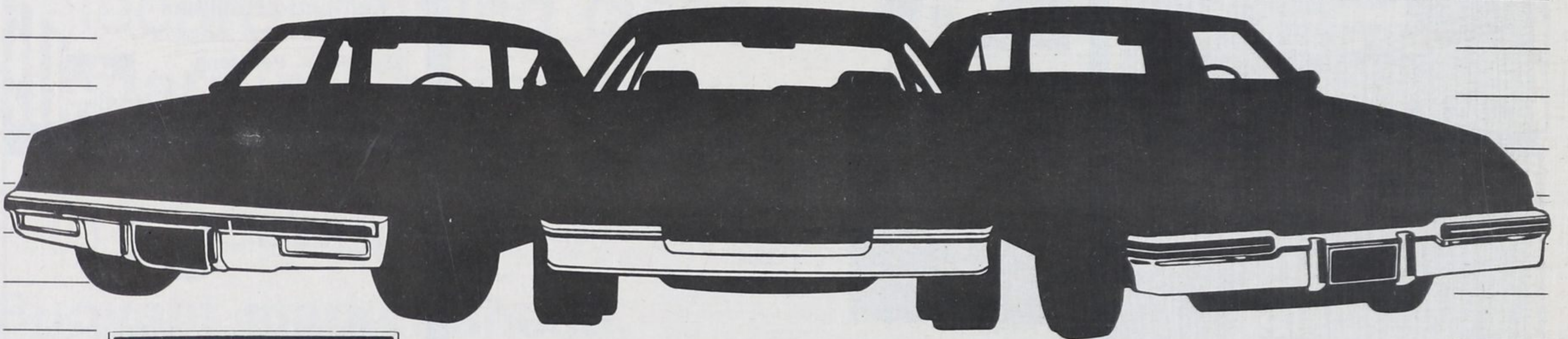
now retired, was one of the employees brought to Canada, and Midland, when Leitz opened its Midland factory.
