Port discusses fires again

The subject of open fires came up again at last week's Port McNicoll council meeting.

Councillor Eleanor Lattimore said Muskoka requires permits for open fires, and she asked why

Port McNicoll did not want to do the same.

At the previous Port council meeting, there was a lengthy discussion of what to do about open fires. There is no bylaw forbidding them or requiring a permit.

Bylaw enforcement officer John Dallaire said he has received approximately 25 to 30 calls complaining about fires.

"All I can tell them is to call the fire department if they think it's out of hand,"

said Dallaire. Councillor Lattimore asked if it wouldn't be practical to require a permit, but Dallaire said, from his point of view it would not be.

He said Midland once had a law forbidding open fires except for barbecues. But that bylaw was a joke, he said, because "if they saw a bylaw enforcement officer coming, they'd stick a marshmallow in and say, 'Hey, we're having a barbecue'."
