Boat show to take over dock

The second Midland Town Dock Boat Show is expected to be at least as comprehensive as was last year's show.

Organizers hope that Vic Carpenter of Port McNicoll will be able to bring the 33 foot, 1920s model, wooden hull, boat which he currently is building. The boat will have a 16 cylinder, 1,000 horsepower engine.

Represented at the boat show on Sept. 26 and 27 will be the range from rowing boats and racing sculls to 40-foot-plus power





This program was created with the safety of people and the protection of boats in mind. It will:

- put ongoing maintenance of existing small craft harbours and facilities on a sounder financial footing;
- re-open harbour facilities closed for safety reasons;
- repair damage caused by storms or high water levels;
- launch new services and facilities at some harbours that will meet the expanding needs of fishermen,

yachtsmen and local industries.

But more importantly local harbour authorities created under this revitalization program will, with the Federal government support, give fishermen and other users a more direct role in the planning, management, operation and maintenance of their harbour.

Project proposals will be analyzed and funded on their individual merits, and announcements on funding will be made as decisions are reached.
