At first, Richardson is counting on between 16 and 24 people to form the base of a strong choir, which eventually should

include upwards of 60. The type of people Richardson hopes will be attracted to join the choir are those who: will make a commitment to show up once a week ("one absence changes the personality of the choir"); have a sensitivity to music and an ability to blend; preferably, can read music ("at least wanting to learn").

All styles of music will be

included in the choir's repertoire. "It will be an eclectic approach - classical, show tunes, operetta and ethnic music."

If all goes on schedule, says the conductor-in-waiting, the choir will perform a concert of Christmas music sometime in December. This would be the first public performance, hopefully the first in a long line.

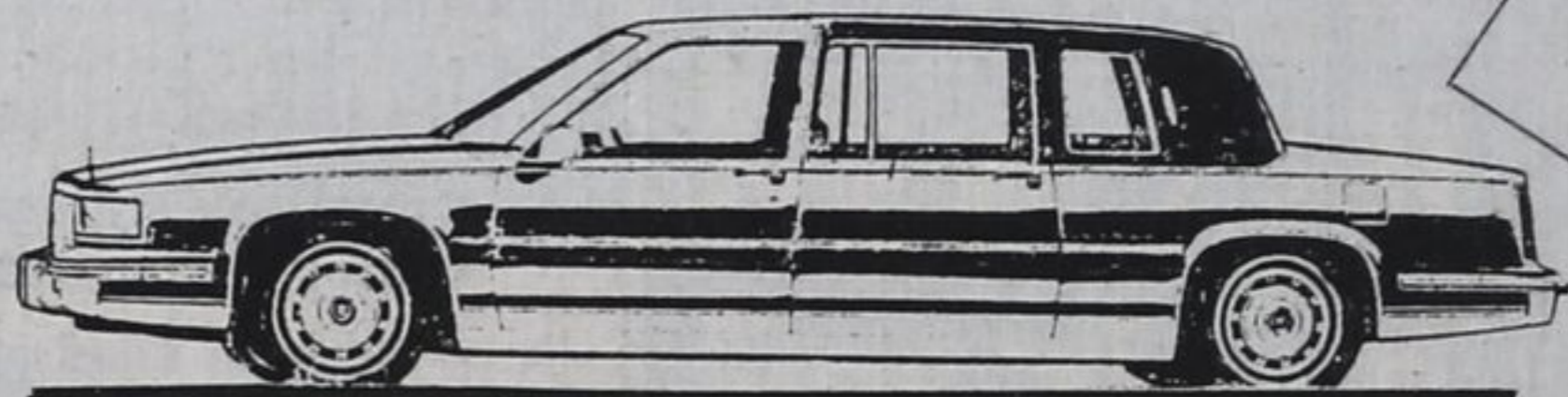
