## One in four now recycling, says NSWMA

Almost one in four households now recycles some of their garbage, according to the North Simcoe Waste Management Association.

At last week's monthly meeting, recycling committee chairman Pat Armstrong said "individual participation in the recycling program is up by 300 per cent since January 1987."

"We've had tremendous growth since last year," said Armstrong.

He added that since Penetang and many other areas started getting weekly pick-ups of their blue recycling bins, the phone has been ringing off the hook.

"The bins are going quite

fast," said Armstrong.

His comments were echoed by recycling program manager, Liz Downer. "Now that we're doing it weekly, we're getting 20 to 30 calls a day from people saying, 'Now I will join.'"

The recycling program costs an estimated \$114,000 a year, which is covered by a provincial government grant. However, that grant money is scheduled to stop coming in by 1989.

The NSWMA now picks up recyclables on a weekly basis in Midland, Penetang, Port McNicoll and most of the part of Tay Township north of Midland.

## Trees should be saved, say residents

Three angry residents hounded Port McNicoll council last Wednesday night over planned construction of a road - and destruction of some trees - on their street.

Over the years, Silverbirch Crescent in Port McNicoll gradually "moved over" to the point where it was 10 feet over a private property line. Every year when the road was treated and snowplowed, workers inched it over, council reported at the previous meeting.

To correct the situation the village planned on moving the road back and making culverts on each side. The plan called for a number of trees to be cut down, which angered some residents who felt that was not necessary.

"The building of the ditch will move the road over 10 feet too much," argued resident John Rose.

But councillor Pat Armstrong countered saying, "we are moving the road to where it rightfully should have been."

But Rose said the ditch was not necessary, and 12 trees could be saved by not having one.

But the Deputy-Reeve, Ross Cameron, said "I've lived in town for 20 years and I dare say I've seen a water problem there."

However, Reeve John Moreau said he would personally take a look at the area involved and "if it does look like there's a possibility of saving those trees, we may do something about it."

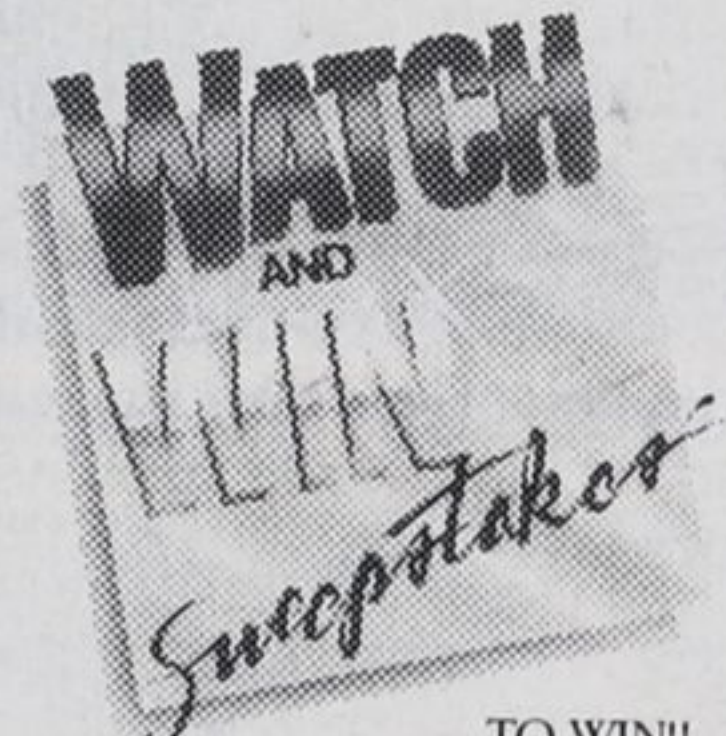
