Defence minister gets pat on back during Legion trip

Midland Legion members told the Minister of Defense in person last week how much they like his ideas for the military.

Perrin Beatty got an earful from almost everybody in the lounge last Tuesday as he paid an informal, non-political visit to the veterans.

"It's about time the military were given the tools they need," Beatty said during a casual discussion with Legion executives.

The defence minister visited Branch 80 after a day of political canvassing for his brother, George,

who later lost his bid for a seat in the provincial election last Thursday.

But the side trip to visit the vets was non-political. Perrin even took off his George Beatty button for the photograph taken by the Midland Times.

Legion members responded positively to the reforms the minister has been implementing for the armed forces.

One legion executive said Beatty was doing "a lot better" at the job than his predecessors.

The visit lasted approximately an hour, during which Beatty made a point

of visiting every table in the lounge.

"A lot of people think freedom is like a mortgage

payment," the defence minister said. "It's not. It's a price you continually have to pay."

\$7.9 million job for Leitz

Ernst Leitz Canada Limited of Midland has been awarded a \$7.9 million Government of Canada contract to supply 203 aviator night vision imaging systems and other equipment to the Canadian Forces.

In addition to the imaging systems, the contract calls for 200 helmet mounts plus manuals, drawings and related date.

The equipment will be used at CFB Lahr, West Germany, and bases in Canada.
