## Local schools see a stunning growth

A stunning 52 per cent growth in enrolment has been experienced by the Simcoe County Roman Catholic Separate School Board since 1983.

And just since 1986 the number of students has jumped by 11.5 per cent.

At the last meeting Sept. 23, the school board discussed how to ac-

comodate all the new students. It noted a number of new schools were being built.

A new St. Ann's school in Penetanguishene was declared to be the top priority of the school board. That message was to be transmitted to the Minister of Education in

case any extra money was found for construction in the Fall. St. Ann's has seen a huge growth of 13 per cent.

In Midland, Monsignor Castex and Sacred Heart schools increased by 4.5 per cent and St. Theresa's high school hit a new high of 364.

## Children's Aid needs volunteers to drive

Even though there has been a boom the last two years in innovative and much-needed services for children and families in the county, they don't do much good if you can't get to them.

So the Children's Aid Society of Midland has taken up the cause and set up a program to supply volunteer drivers.

But "due to the number of programs and a shortage of drivers, it is becoming increasingly difficult to ensure that children get to the treatment they need in order to help them cope with the problems they have encountered," says a press release issued by the society.

The release notes that

"transportation to the various programs for the children has become a serious issue."

The demand for the new programs has been steadily increasing, according to Children's Aid, but they are not "being completely utilized."

Volunteer drivers will

receive their mileage and out of pocket expenses for any assignment they perform. The time requirement varies but usually involves one trip per week.

## Laneway will be closed soon

The lane on the east side of St. Margaret's Church is going to be closed. A new rectory will be built nearby. The former lane will be a driveway to the rectory.

The Town of Midland has owned the lane since early in this century. Once

the closing of the lane is advertised, the land will be conveyed to the church.

The new rectory is part of the construction in the wake of the Dec. 24, 1986 fire which destroyed St. Margaret's Church.
