Oldtimers play in tourney

Prior to the second game, Penetang coach, John Dubeau, made a shrewd coaching decision moving veteran defenceman, Larry Banks, to left wing. John stated he wanted to take advantage of Banks' ability to play over the entire ice surface. The move paid off as Banks counted three times in a 6-3 Penetang victory over Bracebridge Model T Oldtimers. Mike Dubeau, Red Weatherell and Gerald Gignac round-

ed out the scoring. Wetherell and Rick Anderson contributed three assists.

In their third contest, Penetang defeated the West End Rockers from Toronto 7-1. Jim Rooney paced the Penetang attack with a hat trick while Gerald Gignac fired a pair of markers. Gerry Hewitt and Red Weatherell rounded out the scoring. Waxy Gregoire contributed four assists to the victory. Paul Devillers and Ron Jeffery helped out with two assists each.

The victory sent Penetang into the championship game of the Steamer Division against Bracebridge who they had defeated earlier by a 6-3 score. This time around Bracebridge got a little closer, but not enough as Penetang skated to a 6-4 win and the championship. Larry Banks, Rick Anderson, Jim Dubeau, Ron Jeffery and Red Weatherell accounted for the Penetang scoring. Weatherell, Banks and Gregoire each con-

tributed two assists. Weatherell was chosen Most Valuable Player of the Championship game.

Goaltenders Gary Ronald and Ross Weatherell played well throughout the tournament.

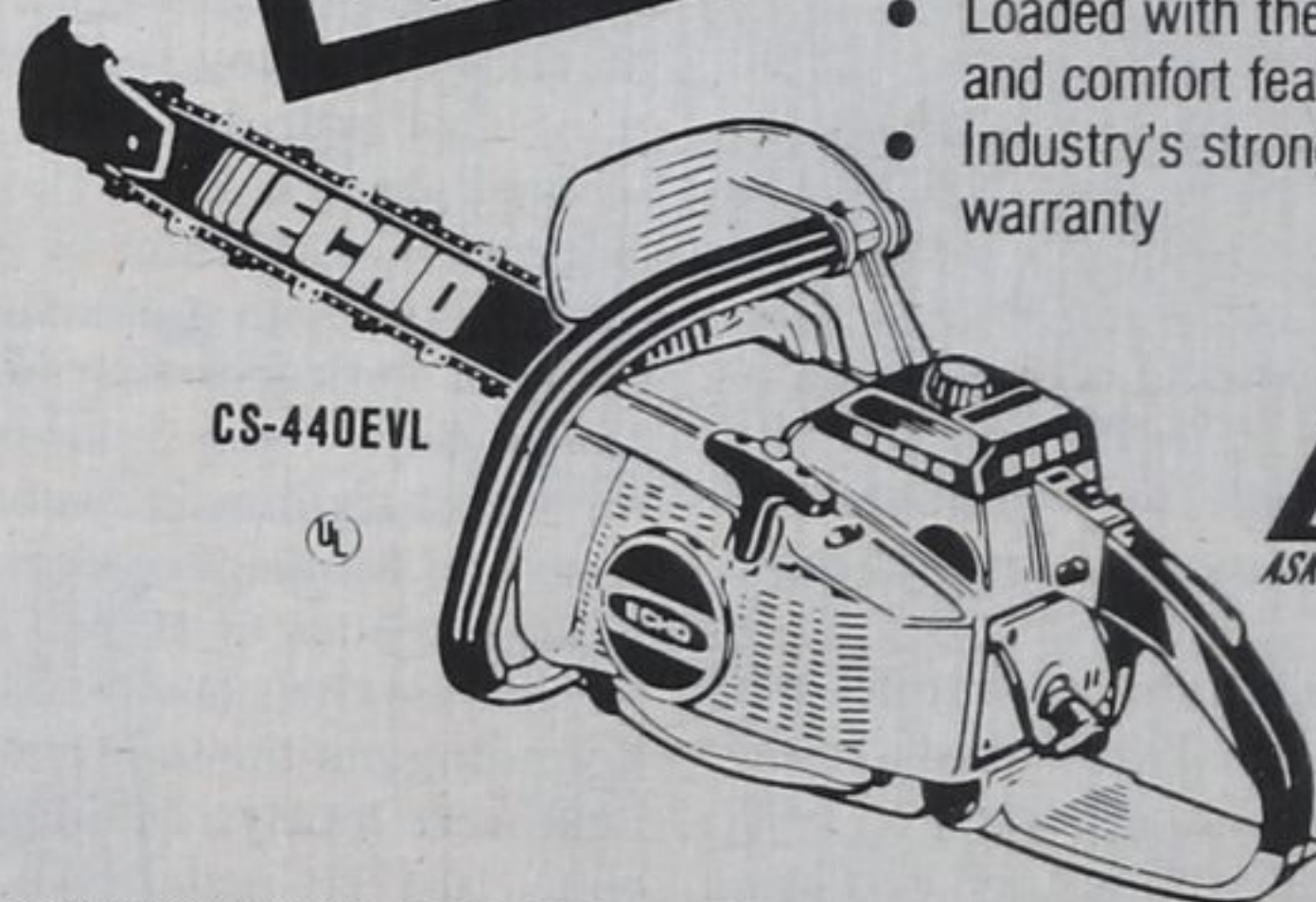
