background, last week. The HDH capital fundraising fund stood at \$1.6 million at last report.

HDH to hit workplace

The capital fundraising campaign for Huronia District Hospital is being taken to the employees of Midland's large industries.

Each employee of the town's largest industries will receive a flyer in the near future. Groups of 20 at an industry will be briefed so that they can spread the word to the rest of the employees in that industry.

The campaign is at the \$1.6 million mark, with \$400,000 to go. The community phase, solicitation by mail of the general population, begins soon.

The campaign is to end in mid-November. The goals of each step of the campaign have been met to date. Arnie DeCarli, chairman of the board of HDH, is confident that the \$2

million goal will be realized.

Last week donations of \$30,000 from Peter Cook of Canadian Tire and \$12,000 from Mike Tolmie of Super X Drugs were received.

Next month, new radiology equipment for one of HDH's two radiology rooms will be installed. The new equipment will replace equip-

ment which is 30 years old. The other set of radiology equipment was purchased when HDH opened in 1976.

The new equipment is the first improvement to result from the capital fundraising campaign. HDH has committed \$500,000 from a reserve account to add to the \$2 million it expects to raise.
